BOARD RECOGNITION - Ms. Pai

Two Columbia HS students, Julie-Ann Destine and Jackie Bryan, worked with Larry Busichio, Director of Student Activities & Athletics and Elizabeth Aaron, Columbia HS Principal, to get a charter for a chapter of the National Honor Society at CHS. The chapter will be able to induct students this spring and it is expected that students in the National Honor Society at CHS will lead a new and broad peer tutoring program connected to the FAST study program. Students Julie-Ann and Jackie originated the chapter.

Matthew Girardi, Columbia High School junior and a member of the CHS student council was awarded the Secretary position at State Student Council — an achievement that has not been awarded to a CHS student since the 1950's.

Columbia High School sophomore, Heather Aliyah Salomon was the winner of the CHS Poetry out Loud Competition and represented the school in a county-wide competition at SOPAC.

Columbia High School junior, Samantha Viqueira, a member of the U.S. Fencing Junior team, won a gold medal at the Junior Pan Ams Championships in Toronto. The U.S. Women's Foil Team defeated Canada, 45-37, in the gold medal final at the Junior Pan Ams.

Jack Woods, a $7^{\rm th}$ grader at MMS won a gold medal in Paris at the biggest foil fencing Championships in the world. Jack won in the category of 439 elite 14 years and under and was the only American to come back with gold.

The student Mock Trial Team at Columbia High School, led by Social Studies teacher Matt Borkowski, finished second in the Essex County Mock Trial Competition, a distinguished and well-fought for honor against the team from Newark Academy.

Lisa Conrad, Columbia High School Teacher of Art, is currently showing her artwork at The College of Architecture and Design Gallery (CoAD Gallery) in an exhibit called "Four Printmakers...Four Decades." Ms. Conrad is also exhibiting new ceramic work in a group show entitled "The Fire Within Us" at Index Art Center in Newark.

Columbia High School Track Coach Lisa Morgan will be inducted into the New Jersey Scholastic Coaches Association Hall of Fame this year and will also be honored at a luncheon in March.

Kaitlyn Walker, Teacher of Music for the middle schools is officially the principal oboist of the Eastern Wind Symphony based in Princeton NJ. The season consists of 5 concerts and is entitled East Meets West, where they are performing works by both American and Japanese composers. Ms. Walker will also be performing with the Monmouth Symphony Orchestra at the Count Basie Theater performing Tchaikovsky 1st Symphony and his Violin Concerto.

Ellen Weisbord, CHS art teacher, is one of 27 NJ artists selected for the 2015 NJ Craft Arts Annual exhibiting at the Morris Museum from February 12- April 20.

Robert White, the Columbia High School boys' fencing coach, was named NJ Boys Fencing Coach of the Year for 2014 and will be honored at a luncheon in March.

SUPERINTENDENT'S MONTHLY UPDATE - Mr. Memoli

Goal 1 Student Learning:

- On for discussion tonight is an update on PARCC Readiness.
- All of our focus schools are submitting assessment data in math and language arts for the cycle 3 review. The members of the regional achievement center will meet with principals to review the status of achieving specific school improvement goals.
- Various innovative projects are taking place across the district, including Virtual Debates at SOMS and Literary Essays for fourth grade students across the district.

Goal 2 Professional Staff:

- A staff developer worked with teachers at Jefferson School on close reading strategies to develop students' ability to analyze text.
- A staff developer worked with K-2 teachers at Seth Boyden and Clinton on writing strategies for our youngest writers. Also Seth Boyden and Clinton Schools the grades 3-5 grade teachers are working with a staff developer on reading workshop strategies and skills.
- Three members of the Preschool committee attended a presentation of a NJDOE approved pre-kindergarten and kindergarten curriculum called "Tools of the Mind" which helps young students develop the skills necessary to access school. We will be inviting them to do a presentation to our preschool staff and other interested parties.

Goal 3 Engagement and Outreach:

- Elementary parent teacher conferences will take place this week. This is a very important opportunity for parents to meet with your child's teacher to learn about all that they are learning and to receive their progress report. Thank you to all of our elementary staff for preparing for these important conferences.
- Presentation about PARCC took place for middle school and elementary families. A letter will go home to all families and staff this evening with further information about PARCC.
- Two Parenting Center events are planned for March, geared towards families of current 5th graders: Getting Ready for Middle School and "Always Changing" 5th Grade Health Film.

Goal 4 Resource Management:

• With the recent snow and bitterly cold temperatures, the facilities department has been very busy responding to heat-related issues and snow removal. Kudos to the custodial staff and maintenance staff for working through the days and nights in response to the snow. Maintenance has also been responding to heating concerns as we have had issues related to the extreme temperatures. We appreciate the cooperation of students and staff, and the understanding of parents,

as classes relocated when there were delays in resolving heating issues.

- A bond sale to re-fund the 2005 and 2008 series of bonds was held on with very positive results. The re-funding resulted in a total savings of over \$1.5 million dollars over the next 13 years, or an average annual savings to debt service of more than \$119,000.
- Registration:
 - Early Kindergarten registration packets are being accepted through Thursday, March 19th. Any kindergarten students not registered by March 19th can be registered as part of the open registration beginning Monday, May 4th. Parents will be notified of Kindergarten orientation no later than the end of May, which they will receive as confirmation of the school assignment.
 - Early high school registration packets will be accepted starting Monday, March 30th through Thursday, April 2nd. Those students who take advantage of the early registration will be able to take advantage of the early high school placement testing, scheduled by appointment only.
 - Preschool registration is ongoing for general education students.
 - Open registration for all grades begins on Monday, May 4th.
 - Budget development continues with state aid figures expected to be released this Thursday. In a continued review of the Seth Boyden figures as outlined for consideration in the December budget analyses, we have some updates regarding the opt in enrollments. The Kindergarten figures reported, indicating the drop in percentage of students opting into the program, did not include some of the students who opted into the program. About 34% of the Kindergarten students have opted into the program. When considering the other non-zoned students currently in the Seth Boyden Kindergarten that were placed at Seth Boyden, the total non-zoned Kindergarten population is actually above the 50%mark we aim for in each grade. Some of the parents that were placed at Seth Boyden because registration at their zoned schools was closed have indicated an interest in returning to their zoned schools for first grade. Continued attention to the Seth Boyden School with regards to budgeting as well as discussions taking place in board committees, including specific discussions regarding recent requests for consideration from the SB PTA are ongoing.

The Board pursued additional names of potential Superintendents and significant progress has been made. The process is ongoing and highly confidential in nature. The Board hopes to have positive news at the next meeting in March.

Joe Viola Spoke in support of the Columbia High School Maplewood Baseball Program and coaches. Stephen Tamayo Spoke in support of the Columbia High School CHS Graduate baseball coaches. Mr. Tamayo credits the coaches for his being able to play college baseball. Spoke in support of CHS baseball coaches Jake Lasofsky Stated that the coaches spend countless hours South Orange working to make players the best they can be. Bill Krais Also supports CHS baseball coaches and Asks the Board for support of the coaches. Baseball Booster President Ted Brackett Appreciates the work of the CHS baseball Maplewood coaches. Would like an independent investigation of CHS baseball program and coaches. Mark Stern Maplewood Brian Clark Also requests a full investigation of the Maplewood situation with baseball coaches.

Marisa Tamayo Spoke about her family's positive experience with the CHS baseball team and coaches. Asks Maplewood parents to support their children. Spoke of son's success on the CHS baseball team Patrick Joyce South Orange and in college baseball. Concerned about possible bullying of CHS baseball players and the ongoing investigation. Concerned about the upcoming Partnership for Katie Rumley Assessment of Readiness for College and Careers Maplewood (PARCC) administration. Elissa Malespina Spoke about PARCC and protocols for students who have opted out of testing and requests that South Orange students who are not being tested be placed in a different area. Acknowledges importance of PARCC testing, but parents should have been informed of their T.J. Whitaker Maplewood Parent and teacher right to opt out. Spoke in support of home-schooled students Andrew Wasden Maplewood participating in sports and extracurricular activities. Hannah Edelman Asks the Board to support and fund student CoAdvisor council officer Matt Girardi at the National Convention in Albuquerque and Regionals in Upstate New York. Also asks that other students are sent to state student council. Matt Girardi States that Columbia High School is full of student leaders. Students who have previously CHS Junior attended nationals have brought back leadership to other students. Maggie Tuohy Thanked the Board for their support of Seth SB Parent Boyden School and the community looks forward to working with the board in its efforts to support Seth Boyden School. Concerned about the Columbia High School math Ruth Lovenkron program. Also asked that the Board reconsiders Maplewood Parent

from the previous Board meeting and putting the procedures together and communicating these procedures. The Board also thanked staff and testing coordinators for their involvement in preparation for administering the test.

The Opt Out rate for the PARCC is very low. Concerns regarding where to place non-tested and opted out students during the test continue to be discussed.
