The GRAMMY Music Educator Award was established to recognize current educators who have made a significant and lasting contribution to the field of music education and who demonstrate a commitment to the broader cause of maintaining music education in the schools. Finalists will be announced later in the year.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Mr. Eastman declared the minutes of the Executive and Public Sessions of February 23, 2015 and the Executive and Special Budget Workshop of March 4, 2015 approved as submitted.

UPDATE ON THE SUPERINTENDENT'S SEARCH PROCESS - Mr. Eastman

After an 8 month process involving the community, board members, administration and staff the Board has decided to hire Dr. John Ramos as the new superintendent of the South Orange - Maplewood School District to begin as of August 1, 2015. Contract terms for Dr. Ramos are approaching finalization. The Board is not voting tonight but contract terms are tentatively written for 5 years, (4 years 11 months) and a base salary of \$177,500. The Board is thankful to administration, staff and the community for their input and participation in focus groups which helped form the basis for the search. Dr. Ramos is scheduled to meet with students, ASCA, SOMEA, community leadership and the general community in April.

SUPERINTENDENT'S MONTHLY UPDATE - Mr. Memoli

Goal 1 is about Student Learning

- On for discussion tonight is a report on New Jersey Department of Education Performance Reports and CHS PSAT Results
- This is the final week of Partnership for Assessment of Readiness for College and Careers (PARCC) performance based assessment; although some make up exams will be administered next week. Overall, PARCC implementation has gone extremely well. We experienced very few technical issues with our chromebooks or network. We had a few instances of confusion with the use of the test administration software. However, all issues were addressed the same day and testing was able to continue as scheduled. A total of 174 students have refused to take the test to date, which represents 4% of those eligible to be tested. Many thanks to teachers and administrators, especially the Assistant Principals, for their hard work and patience in adapting to the new testing protocol, and in supporting our students in this new experience. Particular thanks to Paul Roth, Chief Information Officer, for overseeing all technical aspects of the transition to PARCC. His fastidious preparations set the district up for success in PARCC implementation. The next round of PARCC will begin on April 27th.
- All 9, 10, and 11 grade students have already met with guidance staff to make preliminary course selections for next year. The CHS administration team is working closely to make sure that all students start the year with a final schedule and a drop/add period is not necessary. Guidance staff will be available throughout the summer to address any outstanding changes related to summer school credit recovery, summer programs that lead to course changes, or any other developments that necessitate a course change.
- SOMS held a panel discussion entitled "How do we experience race in the United States and in our community? A conversation about perceptions, stereotypes, and social acceptance." This 8th grade initiative was prompted by students in reaction to national events

- this past fall. 8th graders and the panel guests engaged in an honest and thoughtful discussion about this important topic.
- Focus Schools have completed the cycle 2 review process, and have submitted reports to the Regional Achievement Center (RAC) as required.
- IB unit planning is taking place this month in all content areas. Teachers from each discipline will collaboratively work together and plan a unit of study with essential questions to guide the process.
- We are in the middle of school musical season:
 - o The Columbia High School Musical Ragtime began performances this past weekend, and continues this coming weekend. It is a truly phenomenal production, showcasing the incredible talent of our students and staff in this timely and topical show. The show team made this a true learning experience in every sense of the word, including the opportunity for the cast to meet and talk with members of the original Broadway cast, and an invitation to 6th grade students to attend a special performance for free, and participate in a "Talk Back" with Ms. Aaron, the directors, and stars of the production. Over 150 parents and students attended the "Talk Back" conversation about the themes of the play and the way in which students see the themes resonating in their own lives and America today.
 - o Maplewood Middle School performed The Wiz to packed houses the weekend of February 27-March 1. The talented cast and crew spent months preparing for this delightful production.
 - o Next up: Once Upon a Mattress will be performed at South Orange Middle School the weekend of March 27-29.

Goal 2 pertains to Professional Staff.

- Most recent professional development efforts have been dedicated to preparing for PARCC.
- The administrative team had another full-day workshop with Dr. Khyati Joshi to continue working on culturally responsive teaching and promoting social justice in our schools.

Goal 3 concerns Engagement and Outreach.

- Elementary parent teacher conferences took place the last week of February. Thank you to all of our elementary staff for preparing for these conferences, and to all of the families who took part in this important opportunity to support our students and further the home/school partnership.
- Board and administration members will join the Seth Boyden community this Saturday, March 21st. To discuss parents' hopes for Seth Boyden and how the Board of Education and administration can help fulfill the community's vision for our demonstration school

Goal 4 pertains to Resource Management.

• As part of the budget presentation, we proposed some changes to our administrative structure We will make a final determination of the administrative structure for next year in consultation with the new superintendent, Dr. Ramos.

• Registration:

- o As a reminder, Early Kindergarten registration packets are being accepted through this Thursday, March 19th. Any kindergarten students not registered by March 19th can be registered as part of the open registration beginning Monday, May 4th. Parents will be notified of Kindergarten orientation no later than the end of May, which they will receive as confirmation of the school assignment.
- o Early high school registration packets will be accepted starting Monday, March 30th through Thursday, April 2nd. Those students who take advantage of the early registration will be able to take advantage of the early high school placement testing, scheduled by appointment only.
- o Preschool registration is ongoing for general education students. We already have 20 general education spots filled, out of a maximum of 32.
- o Open registration for all grades begins on Monday, May 4th.

Congratulations to the Achieve Foundation and everyone involved for their incredibly successful "Night of 100 Dinners." More than \$75,000 was raised through dozens of different events throughout our two towns. Thank you to Deborah Prinz, Achieve Executive Director, and to the dozens of hosts and hundreds of guests, who made this such a successful event, providing much needed funding for innovation and excellence in our schools. Many thanks to the staff members who went from party to party to share with the guests some highlights of the important work being done in our schools.

DISCUSSION

New Jersey Department of Education Performance Reports and CHS PSAT Results - Mrs. Grierson

Mrs. Grierson presented a Powerpoint presentation on behalf of Mr. Roth outlining the following 2013-2014 data:

- District Accountability Report
- School Performance Reports
- Columbia High School PSAT Results

The presentation was followed by a brief discussion including:

- Underperforming test scores. Concerns about the gap in results at Maplewood Middle School especially in math. The gaps are the reason for focus schools and improvements must be made.
- Significant decline at Maplewood Middle and Clinton School must be addressed.
- Professional development particularly for our struggling students, after school programs and Saturday programs are being offered to address concerns. Change to the common core significantly upped the game. See some gains but the district has a higher target.
- District must begin to listen to what teachers have been telling us for the past three years. Discontinue the IB Program, and address students who are not receiving social studies and science.

2015-16 Budget - Mrs. Schneider

Mrs. Schneider presented a Powerpoint reviewing the budget information shared at the March 12, 2015 Budget Forum including:

- Available budget documents
- Proposed budget revenue sources
- Tax levy cap adjustments and banked cap
- Budget considerations
- Personnel adjustments
- Estimated tax impact

Discussion following the presentation included the following:

- Elementary students should have World Language.
- Learning a language is much easier if you start when you are young.

• Would like to see discussion of possibly having a global studies program at Seth Boyden.

Ms. Kritzberg left at 9:45pm 9 voting members present

- Concerned that that vast majority of cuts are at the elementary level, especially when we have not begun to address the needs at Seth Boyden and Clinton Schools.
- Don't want to price people out of town but would like to consider reallocating resources to support elementary needs.
- Restructuring of administration should be left to the new superintendent.
- Concerned about increasing out of district tuition. Should try to address increasing tuition rates at the state level.
- Look at other districts and see what they are doing to save money. Have we really saved money with outsourcing?
- Need to consider some of these questions in next year's budget analyses. Cannot say we do not want cuts but not be ready to increase funding.
