SOMSD was named one of the "Best Communities in Music Education" by the National Association of Music Merchants (NAMM). 2015-16 Budget - Mrs. Schneider

Mrs. Schneider presented the proposed 2015-16 school budget before the Board for approval with budget highlights including but not limited to:

- Fund mandated programs such as TeachNJ, PARCC and Common Core Curriculum Standards
- Maintain curricula and co-curricular programs including funding for the arts.
- ${}^{\blacksquare}$ Provides sufficient resources for enrollment increases, including additional $7^{\rm th}$ grade teams at the middle schools
- Provides staffing for opening Montrose Early Learning Center
- Maintains revitalized world language program at the elementary schools.
- Addresses requests for additional resources at Seth Boyden School
- Provides resources for middle states accreditation process
- Includes funding for Educational Equity Consultant
- Includes adjusted middle school schedules increase physical education instructional time.
- Provides additional supplies for increased AP enrollment

 Includes adjustments for increased employee healthcare contributions and additional requirements of the Affordable Care Act.

Name	Topic
Amelia Nickles Seth Boyden Parent	Appreciates that the Board has taken Seth Boyden PTA requests into consideration. Asks if the budget can support all elementary students to be reading at grade 2 and if not, how can the Board support funding other programs?
Rachel Fisher Seth Boyden Parent	Thanked the Board for listening to the PTA and Seth Boyden Community. Seth Boyden has the highest poverty level in the district and students do not come with the same level of preparedness. The budget should address this to close the equity gap.
Susan Brody 4 th Grade Teacher	Spoke about the unique experience working at Seth Boyden and the task of learning to teach at very high and very low levels and the large class sizes. The Board's support is invaluable.
Tia Swanson Seth Boyden	Spoke about the Seth Boyden petition submitted tonight, which supports requests of staff, administration and parents of Seth Boyden to get the budgetary and academic intervention support and full-time social worker; but not at the expense of other district schools.
Steve Latz Maplewood	Does not support the budget. The Board has not fully looked at the high school schedules and non-mandated programs with low enrollment. Decisions need to be made about trade-offs and the resources should be shifted to meet elementary needs.
Ken Feinleib SOMS & SB Parent	Not asking for special treatment, but believes it is a benefit to middle and high schools that all students thrive.
Bruce Fryer CHS Parent	Supports smaller class sizes and the Columbia High School Instructional Learning Academy (CHILA).
Leslie Kantor CHS Parent	Spoke about the CHILA Program an alternative that used to be at Montrose. Would like clarification as to whether or not the program is being cut.

Mr. Memoli indicated that there is no plan to cut the CHILA program. There are fluctuations to the program based on enrollment so some staff may have part of their time designated to other classes, but the program will not be cut.

Mr. Memoli reiterated that the Seth Boyden comments regarding adding funds to cultural arts, maintaining lower enrollments, academic intervention and a full-time social worker were heard. The Board is moving forward with addressing these concerns for next year.

The presentation was followed by a brief discussion among Board members including:

- Board members thanked Mrs. Schneider for the hard work that is put into preparing the budget.
- A discussion on looking further at alternative healthcare options.
- Appreciation for support of elementary schools.
- Question on how much we are spending on contracted services.
- Further discussion on the elementary world language program.

Middle Schools Transformation Update - Mr. Adams and Mr. Uglialoro

Mr. Adams and Mr. Uglialoro described changes to the middle school schedule. Changes include repurposing the rotating schedule into "WIN" (Whatever I Need) period, which allows more academic support.

Mr. Adams defined the WIN period and intervention/enrichment opportunities available [presentation on file in the Board Secretary's Office].

The Board discussion following the presentation included the following questions:

- Where is the conference period, especially for 6th graders?
- Will there be a longer school day?
- How is this schedule addressing Focus School status?
- Is there a data team reviewing the results?
- Are students able to go to different teachers during the WIN period as they can with the conference period?
- How can we avoid a student having World Language 1^{st} semester in 7^{th} grade and then 2^{nd} semester in 8^{th} grade?
- Will all students now have access to World Language and Related Arts?
- Is there a way to put the choice back into the hands of students to choose between World Language and Related Arts?

Mr. Walthour CHS Parent Feels there is a lack of African American role models in lacrosse. This is the most diverse lacrosse team he has seen and this is due to Coach Hill being part of the program. Sports and art should be and enjoyable. Problematic that these children are feeling pain in their sports.

Gus Heningburg Maplewood Spoke on behalf of Mr. Hill. Feels there are different rules for whites and blacks. Mr. Hill should be rehired. Students are afraid of speaking up out of fear of retaliation.

Accelerated ELA and International Baccalaureate - Mrs. Grierson

Mrs. Grierson spoke about the Accelerated English Language Arts and International Baccalaureate programs. New criteria for Accelerated ELA should be developed since the NJASK for placement no longer exists. The new criteria will help achieve this goal and make the class available to those who can benefit from it.

Mrs. Grierson recommends discontinuing the International Baccalaureate (IB) Program. After three years of implementation, the program has not taken root as envisioned. With so many competing initiatives the implementation of a framework for teaching IB was impacted. The money spent for professional development is not a loss of resources, it will ultimately support good teaching.

The discussion regarding IB will continue at the next Board Meeting when we will have the resolution on which to vote.

Mr. Stern presented a Powerpoint presentation on HIB and the OCR Resolution Agreement. The presentation included the HIB Bill of Rights and requirements for reporting HIB incidents. The presentation also included the introduction of Sage Educational Consultants and their role in addressing the OCR agreement.

Sage Consultants is the district consultant working diligently on the OCR complaint. Multiple meetings have taken place and data is being analyzed.

A brief discussion after the presentation addressed the importance of looking at HIB complaints in extracurricular activities.
