A Regular Meeting of the Board of Education of South Orange-Maplewood was held in the District Meeting Room at the Administration Building, 525 Academy Street, Maplewood, New Jersey, on October 19, 2015.

Board President Wayne Eastman called the meeting to order at 7:45 p.m.

8 VOTING MEMBERS AND ONE STUDENT REPRESENTATIVE PRESENT

BOARD RECOGNITION - Read by Ms. Pai

Columbia High School Senior Jared Kofsky has been recognized for his reporting of local news and his photography. Jared's work was featured in Local Beat, NJ News Commons' for his reporting in Essex County Place. In addition, Jared's photograph was a semifinalist in the Gateway National Recreation Area Photo Contest and he also won 1st place in the youth category of the Essex County Nature Photography Contest.

South Orange sisters Emma Joy (Columbia HS 10th grader) and Quinn Joy (South Orange Middle School 7th grader) launched "Girls Helping Girls. Period (GHGP)," a campaign to collect feminine hygiene products — and cash donations to purchase them — for girls and women in need. GHGP also seeks to raise awareness of the issue, and to encourage others to find ways to collect items. So far there were enough donations collected for over 100 women to use for a year.

Under the direction of Maplewood Middle School Music Teacher Regina Bradshaw, the $7^{\rm th}/8^{\rm th}$ grade Select Chorus attending High Note Festivals and was awarded the top rating of Superior.

Tim Beaumont, 4th grade teacher at Jefferson Elementary, Sandra Smith, 5th grade teacher at Seth Boyden and Melissa Butler, Teacher of Language Arts

at South Orange Middle School were recently inducted into the Alpha Epsilon Lambda Graduate Students Honor Society at Montclair State University. These teachers were inducted in relation to their graduate studies in Educational Leadership.

Kate Dodd, Art Teacher at Columbia HS, attended an AP Art History Institute in Rome this past summer at the John Cabot University, courtesy of an AP College Board Fellowship Award.

April Intile and Heather Merrigan, Kindergarten Teachers from Marshall Elementary School were profiled in an article published in The National Association for the Education of Young Children (NAEYC), a professional membership organization that works to promote high-quality early learning for all young children, by connecting early childhood practice, policy, and research. Their article profiled the importance of block play in the classroom and how to incorporate math and science standards.

Laura Kruglinski, Teacher of Art at Jefferson Elementary School, organized an art fundraiser which raised \$1,392 for the Jefferson Art Department!

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Mr. Eastman declared the minutes of the Executive and Public Sessions of September 21, 2015 approved as presented.

SUPERINTENDENT'S MONTHLY UPDATE

Negotiations between the Board and the South Orange Maplewood Education Association (SOMEA) are nearing completion. They are in the process of finalizing the salary guides and then SOMEA members will have to ratify the agreement. Thank You to all involved for moving this process forward.

Goal 1 Student Learning:

- Columbia High School has chartered a National Honor society chapter.
- Middle States Association will visit Columbia High School. One of the resolutions on for action tonight is a board affirmation of the goals developed for Columbia High School through this process.
- Eighteen student members of the Columbia High School Minority Student Achievement Network attended the national conference last week, and returned with action plans for Columbia High School.
- The State has announced that state-wide Partnership for Assessment of Readiness for College and Careers (PARCC) results will be available at the end of the month. School and student results are not expected to be released until mid- to late-November.

• Tonight, the Board of Education will conduct the second reading of a proposed Access and Equity Policy. Such a policy allows our district to move significantly forward in our efforts to be an exemplary suburban school system. Such a policy will allow us to finally break the cycle of discussion that has stymied this district for decades and sets the needed tone for our learning community - shifting the conversation from "will we" to "how". Once approved, our attention and time can be focused on implementation on behalf of all of South Orange Maplewood's children and young adults.

Goal 2 Professional Staff:

- We are continuing to build on our professional development work Including workshops on:
 - o Issues of social justice and bias awareness.
 - o Differentiated instruction in the middle schools.
 - o A learning walk with Columbia High School Teachers.
 - Maximizing middle school students' mathematical learning through the use of powerful instructional strategies, focused on retention and scaffolding.

Goal 3 Engagement and Outreach:

- o There will be an update on our pilot of Let's Talk! Later this evening.
- An elementary town hall meeting took place and a meeting for secondary families is scheduled.
- We are continuing to strengthen our partnership with Maplewood and South Orange, and our next meeting with town officials, board members and senior staff is scheduled for November 19th.
- We re-launched the e-newsletter, which will be a monthly communication. We sent it to all families and staff, not just those who had previously subscribed, in order to reach the full community.

Goal 4 Resource Management:

- In our continuing efforts to provide real time security, we are adding a security guard to each middle school. This is being done immediately.
- Administrators have been involved with county and state meetings regarding security protocols. Updates will be shared with staff at the monthly emergency management meeting.

Dr. Ramos introduced Mr. Robles as Supervisor of World Languages.

Dr. Robles has been a teacher in the district since 2000 and is excited to take the step from teacher to supervisor. He has a lot of ideas and is grateful for the opportunity.

HEARING OF INDIVIDUALS AND DELEGATIONS

Topic

Randy Nathan Spoke about HIB incidents in the District. Finds Maplewood Dr. Ramos to be very responsive but feels that the HIB Self-Assessment reports last month does not reflect the reality around the number of HIB violations at the high school.

Mrs. Lawson Muhammad questioned the role of security guards at the middle schools. Dr. Ramos explained the roles of the security guards will be communicated after a meeting with principals. Necessary protocols will be in place and security guards will receive appropriate training for how to integrate into the school community.

DISCUSSION

Name

DISTRICT GOALS - Mr. Eastman

District goals are aligned with the Superintendent's contract under which he will be operating. The district goals are much shorter but reference back to traditional milestones and indicators. The Board will continue in development of strategic planning with data from the Education Summit.

District Goals include:

Goal 1 Student Learning: Promote the intellectual growth of all students. Goal 2 Professional Staff: Consistently and collaboratively lead students of diverse backgrounds and learning styles to learn at or above the appropriate grade-level standards.

Goal 3 Engagement and Out Reach: Communicate effectively with parents, students and the South Orange Maplewood Community. Goal 4 Resource Management: Pursue and achieve goals 1-3 while slowing the rate of increase in operating expenditures.

Board members discussed the new streamlined goals, implementing the goals, and professional development based on state directives. Board members also discussed the language of goal 4 to remove the option of a tax impact of greater than 2%.

POLICY 5755.1 ACCESS AND EQUITY 2ND READING - Ms. Baker

The Access and Equity Policy takes the contract for choice concept and makes it clear that choice should be available to all students in the district. The Board is committed to access to higher level courses. Passing of the policy gives the District a license to move. Dr. Ramos' commitment is that we will move deliberately and as quickly as possible. There is a lot of work to be done with implementing this policy.

EDUCATION SUMMIT - Dr. Ramos

Dr. Ramos presented at Powerpoint Presentation for the upcoming Education Summit [presentation on file in Board Secretary's Office]. The Education Summit will address key variables in creating a strategic plan for the District. The summit will bring stakeholders from across the community to discuss multiple proposed topics. Data collected at the summit will be used to inform the Strategic Plan. Updates regarding progress will be given regularly.

Board members thanked Dr. Ramos for this excellent opportunity for the South Orange Maplewood community to discuss important matters in this type of forum.

LET'S TALK UPDATE - Mrs. Turner and Mr. Roth

Mr. Roth and Mrs. Turner Presented a Powerpoint presentation on the Let's Talk Software program currently in use by the District [presentation on file in Board Secretary's Office]. Let's Talk has been up and running since September 11. Let's Talk provides an easy way for anyone in the community to submit comments, questions, concerns or compliments 24/7. Responses are guaranteed within 2 business days. So far the Let's Talk program is working as anticipated. About 75% of the communications have been from parents who have questions or concerns. A few have been complimentary communication about staff.

HARRASSMENT, INTIMIDATION & BULLYING (HIB) - SELF ASSESSMENT REPORT - Mr. Stern

Mr. Stern presented a Powerpoint presentation on HIB [presentation on file in Board Secretary's Office]. The top five District priorities regarding HIB are:

- 1. Clarification of the definition of HIB. The community needs a better understanding of anti-bullying laws.
- 2. More attention must be given to the High School and Middle School in all areas of HIB.
- 3. Improved communication with the community.
- 4. Provide a better understanding of the Anti-Bullying Law.
- 5. Incorporating the HIB Law into our daily programs.

Board members had the opportunity to ask questions regarding HIB. Discussion included how remediation is done how are parties being held accountable, and what trainings have taken place and what trainings are planned.

Violence and Vandalism Report - Mr. Roth

Mr. Roth presented a Powerpoint presentation on Violence and Vandalism for the 2014-2015 School Year [presentation on file in Board Secretary's Office]. A total of 215 incidences were recorded for the district in all categories from violence, vandalism, weapons, substance abuse and HIB. Violence and Vandalism incidents have decreased since the prior year while all other categories have seen an increase.

Following the presentation Board members discussed how incidents are reported and recorded and asked if this information is delivered to the Board in real time throughout the year. The Board also discussed the increase in weapons and substance abuse cases. What is the Administration doing to address these matters? Social Services must be in place to support students who may otherwise turn violent.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

Student Report - Ms. Kambili

Ms. Kambili suggested prioritizing the public speak portion of the Board meeting to offer students the opportunity to talk first. Ms. Kambili reported on student activities and involvement. She indicated that communication has been impacted by the elimination of homeroom periods.

Mrs. Lawson-Muhammad thanked Ms. Kambili for her report and suggested that the Board may want to see reports from the student groups as they have ideas to bring forth to the Board.

Equity and Excellence - Mr. Bennett

The committee discussed the "Whatever is Needed" (WIN) period, The Gifted and Talented, and a new course being considered at Columbia High School. The committee also discussed Quality Single Accountability Continuum (QSAC), District Improvement Plan, Focus Schools and briefly about District Goals.

Suggestions from Board Members include explaining to the community how the WIN period came about and what we are doing to resolve some issues with it as well as implementing the WIN period so that teachers feel supported.

Policy and Monitoring - Ms. Baker

The committee discussed how the District's obligations under the Office of Civil Rights (OCR) agreement will affect the Access and Equity Policy. The committee also discussed review of Academic Placement Policy, 504 Policy development and becoming familiar with Child Find to identify students in need of services. The committee will provide monthly policy recommendations and have already identified three policies including administration of medication, Dyslexia and meeting the needs of transgender students.

Community Engagement and Outreach - Mrs. Wright

The committee discussed stakeholder engagement and community inclusion in the Education Summit. The committee is reviewing the policy on suicide, in consideration of the necessary training of staff to identify students in crisis. There has been improved communication to Board Members.

The committee discussed the need for better communication for the Montrose Early Childhood Center. Maplewood Middle School Staff asked to meet with the Superintendent and the committee addressed making this happen.

Finance, Facilities and Technology - Mrs. Lawson-Muhammad

The committee discussed district goals and the Education Summit and how both will impact the 2016-17budget development. The committee also discussed increasing enrollment, facility needs and safety and security. The committee also reviewed drafts of the QSAC report and the Comprehensive Maintenance Plan to be presented.
