Thomas Whitaker CHS Teacher	Spoke about the climate in the district including recent racial incidents and indicated this has happened in the past. The district cannot sell out black students by remaining silent.
Theresa Quick CHS Librarian	Feels the lack of diversity among Columbia High School staff is unacceptably low. Urges the Board to reconsider the reassignment and transfer of staff and what it would mean to the students of Columbia High School.
Aidan Reeves 9 <sup>th</sup> grade student	Spoke about the potential elimination of Accelerated Language Arts. Does not believe the material is too mature for $9^{\rm th}$ grade students.
Carson Cummings CHS student	Spoke about the climate in the district. Believes that the district should address cultural competency with students beginning in kindergarten. The district should celebrate diversity.
Elisa Leone CHS Sophmore	Although growing up in a racially diverse environment have recently noticed a lack of education on racism. We should further our education against racism.
Selah Marley CHS Senior	SOMSD is deliberately choosing to deny racism. Why isn't anything being done about it? Why are black students disciplined while white students are not? Why aren't there more black students in AP courses? Why aren't there more black teachers?
Kendra Whitaker CHS student	Spoke about the blackface picture posted on social media. Would like a public apology and for the students involved to write a paper on the History of black face.

Liana Runsie CHS Student Not surprised by recent events at Columbia High School. Feels administration is satisfied by ignoring the issue. Educational needs of all students should be addressed.

Janel Anicette CHS Student Spoke about recent racial incidents. Finds it it disturbing to see acts of ignorance especially in a district that says it celebrates diversity.

Coobee Darcelin CHS student

Became aware of racial slurs on social media and told a teacher. Announcements were made addressing the matter. Suggests educating students about the impact of their statements and actions.

Tristan Lengus CHS Senior Spoke about racism in South Orange Maplewood School District. United we come to fight for what we believe in.

Salimah Latham Maplewood Thanked Mr. Stern for follow-up after the April Board meeting and also to Mr. Walston and Ms. Patterson-Samuels, Marshall Principal. Concerned that teacher involved in an incident involving her son will be honored at the retirement ceremony in June. Requests recognition does not take place.

Schneidine Jean-Baptiste CHS Student

Transferred to Columbia from Irvington Public Schools. It appears diverse but this is a mask. Feels racial issues are being brushed aside and not addressed.

Sri Taylor CHS student Outraged and hurt by blackface and racial slurs posted on social media. Feels administration is more concerned about how this incident made Columbia High School look than it is about how it made students feel. Now that the issue has been made public it should be addressed and the community needs to be educated about race.

Morgan Hillis Maplewood Spoke about the accelerated English Language Arts (ELA) and echoed the sentiments of the earlier speaker that students should be allowed to take challenging courses. Disappointed that the decision to remove the program is based on generalities.

Mtume Findley CHS Student President of Diversity Rocks and founder of the black student union. Asks what the Board intends on doing about the racism that exists. South Orange and Maplewood are diverse but racism needs to be tackled.

Mrs. Baker indicated appreciation for the candor, courage and frankness shared by the students who spoke tonight.

Columbia High School students, Kayla Fleming, junior, and Sally Carnevale, sophomore, members of The Special Dance Company, received scholarships at the NJ High School Dance Festival.

The Columbia High School spring track team led by new coach Chris Faraone, performed very well at the Penn Relays last week. The girls  $4\times100$  relay team placed  $2^{\rm nd}$  in their heat during the qualifying round on Penn Relays with a NJ #1 time of 48.55 seconds. That time advanced CHS to the Large School final and the Tri-State Final. The  $4\times100$  team consisted of Senior Cheyenne Trigg, Sophomore Ciara French, Freshman

Lillian Williams and Junior Dahria Lewis. The 48.55 time by CHS was the  $24^{\rm th}$  fastest time among the 628 4x100 teams that finished and is more than a second faster than its previous season best of 49.62.

Thirty-one members of the Maplewood Middle School Model UN Club participated in the largest middle school Model UN conference in New York City. MMS delegates took on the roles of actual ambassadors representing and took on the role of Ugandan diplomats - working in committees such as United Nations High Commission for Refugees, UNICEF, World Food Programme, and United Nations Development Programme. Two students, Zoe Ferguson and Josie Lally, 6<sup>th</sup> graders, won their committee's award for Outstanding Position paper - two of only thirteen such awards given.

The Wright Family was among the honorees at the Essex County Hoops Legend Dinner. Johanna Wright, her daughter Jazmine Wright, and Ms. Johanna Wright's late husband Lonnie Wright were honored. Ms. Johanna Wright is former girls' varsity basketball head coach, former SOMSD teacher and current board member. Ms. Jazmine Wright is a Columbia High School graduate, a former member of the girls' varsity basketball team and currently is the Columbia High School girls' varsity basketball head coach as well as a teacher at South Orange Middle School.

Ms. Johanna Wright also received the National Black Association, Inc. 2016 Women in Leadership Award for "Outstanding Example, Demonstrated Leadership & Model of Professionalism." In addition she received the Essex County Education Association's (ECEA) Human and Civil Rights Award.

#### APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Ms. Baker declared the minutes of the Executive and Public Sessions of April 18, 2016 and May 2, 2016 Board Meetings approved as presented.

# SUPERINTENDENT'S MONTHLY UPDATE - Dr. Ramos

Dr. Ramos addressed recent incident of racism and Anti-Semitism and indicated plans for several initiatives to promote tolerance and acceptance in our schools, and to help students develop greater sensitivity to cultural differences. The district is also connecting with local community leaders to involve them in the process.

Dr. Ramos also gave an update on the HIB investigation. Dr. Seitz continues to review documentation and conduct interviews and anticipates completing his report before Memorial Day.

Goal 1 Student Learning and promoting the intellectual growth of all students:

- Columbia High School students are taking Advanced Placement exams over the next two weeks. Over 450 students are taking 793 exams in our 21 courses and have the potential to gain college credit in addition to having spent this year doing college-level work in those courses.
- Students at CHS will be doing The Partnership for Assessment of Readiness for College and Careers (PARCC) make ups next week to

- address the two-day server failure of Pearson during the first week of 9th grade testing.
- CHS students who had achieved honors status, National Merit commendation, AP scholar distinctions from the College Board were commended at the annual CHS Scholars' Night. The night also saw the induction of a group of 33 members of the CHS chapter of the National Honor Society, which has been re-chartered by Principal Aaron and Dr. Giordano after an absence of many years at CHS.
- From now through the end of the year, students will be showing off what they have learned in concerts, art shows, field days, and other end-of-year celebrations.

#### Goal 2 Professional Staff:

- Dr. Joshi conducted a full day training for a cohort of K-12 teachers who have been working all year on cultural competency and anti-bias education.
- Sixth and Seventh grade math teachers met to plan strategies to support students who have opted for more challenging coursework.
- 20 CHS teachers are in a reading group on Dr. Tatum's 20-year old book "Why are all the Black Kids Sitting Together in the Cafeteria?" SOMSD staff participated in a conversation with Dr. Tatum and some students and staff attended her evening talk hosted by the Community Coalition on Race.

### Goal 3 Engagement and Outreach:

- Hundreds of 8<sup>th</sup> grade families participated in a 9<sup>th</sup> grade transition night with Principal Aaron and a panel of students, which was followed by a special program on athletics and activities on the high school level.
- Math Supervisors Kim Beane and Mani Arguelles held 2 math meetings last week to help middle school parents understand the math options available and make informed choices for their children's placement, in accordance with the Access and Equity Policy.
- Achieve hosted a "Maker Madness" event. Hundreds of children and their grownups came to CHS to explore science, technology, engineering, art and math with hands-on activities.
- A Community Forum on Security and School Climate, is being held in conjunction with the two towns. Among the topics, which will feature school culture broadly, will be a discussion of the possibility of adding a "School Resource Officer" (SRO) at CHS.

#### Goal 4 Resource Management:

- A State Aid Forum is being planned in partnership with both towns and with the staff of Assemblywoman Mila Jasey.
- We have received the results from all of the schools of the lead level testing in the drinking water supplies, and will post the results on our website. We tested 145 locations in the district all water fountains, nurse's offices, kitchen water supplies, and ice machines. All of the results were below the EPA recommended levels of less than .015 mg/liter. All but one of the results were at or below .004 mg/liter, with the majority having readings of less than .001 mg/liter. The one fountain at Clinton which had an inflated reading has been taken off line and is being replaced with a filtered fountain.

Goal Five concerns creating a framework for advancing the work of the district including the collaborative development of a comprehensive Strategic Plan:

- The Action Planning teams shared their early vision for operationalizing each strategy, and what they are doing to gather information as they narrow down possible goals and begin to develop concrete action steps.
- The communications action planning team is recommending outreach strategies to help the community stay engaged in the process, while the plans are still in formation.

Goal Six concerns securing required external approvals

• We are still awaiting a response from Office of Civil Rights (OCR) to our latest submissions.

# BOARD PRESIDENT'S UPDATE - Ms. Baker

Ms. Baker discussed the Board's intent to address issues of equity and meaningful opportunity. Testimonies during the public speak represents challenges we all face and what is right for our children. We need to move beyond paper and pencil and have a community where every child knows what is right and has the courage to speak up.
