BOARD RECOGNITION - Mrs. Lawson-Muhammad

Clinton Elementary and Marshall Elementary are recipients of Michelle Obama's Lets Move Active Schools Campaign Award. Executive Director Charlene Burgeson will visit each school on Monday, September 19 and present the schools with an award at the Regular Board of Education meeting Monday night.

As the national solution to ensure that 60 minutes of physical activity a day is the norm in K-12 schools, *Let's Move!* Active Schools equips schools with the resources and tools to increase physical education and physical activity opportunities for students, and to cultivate an Active School environment. *Let's Move!* Active Schools is powered by a national collaborative of health, education and private sector organizations that strives to bring these benefits to every child across the country.

Ms. Bonita Samuels, Principal, Ms. Marci Grosholz and Mr. Dillon White, Physical Education Teachers, will accept the award and recognition on behalf of Marshall Elementary. Ms. Ann Bodnar, Principal, Mr. Jeff Lehman and Ms. Jordyn Lachmund, Physical Education Teachers, will accept the award and recognition on behalf of Clinton Elementary.

Three schools, Seth Boyden, Tuscan and Jefferson have met the rigorous requirements to achieve Sustainable Jersey for Schools certification. These schools join a group of 83 schools that were awarded the Sustainable Jersey for Schools certification in 2016 with only five schools in Essex County that are certified.

Sustainable Jersey for Schools is a certification program for public schools in New Jersey, launched by Sustainable Jersey, a nonprofit, nonpartisan organization that provides tools, training and financial incentives to support and reward municipalities and schools as they pursue sustainability programs.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Ms. Baker declared the minutes of the Executive and Public Sessions of August 22, 2016 and Public Special Session on August 24, 2016 approved as presented.

SUPERINTENDENT'S MONTHLY UPDATE

Goal 1 Student Learning and promoting the intellectual growth of all students:

- The first day of school opened smoothly, thanks to the dedicated efforts of teachers and administrators, the incredible helpfulness of parent volunteers, and the great attitude of students. Students in grades K-5 also came back to new classroom libraries.
- Seth Boyden Principal Damion Frye and the kindergarten teachers piloted a new outreach initiative, with summer home visits to incoming kindergarten families. Each kindergartener was also provided with a new Seth Boyden Backpack, filled with school supplies. What a great welcome to school for the class of 2029!
- Teachers have begun benchmark assessments to determine individual strengths and set learning goals for all students in all grades.

- Staff at both middle schools have been revising schedules to create opportunities for students who want to take chorus and band or orchestra, instead of choosing just one music class.
- Update on enrollment and class sizes
 - Elementary school classes are currently within policy guidelines.
 The following grades are closed:
 - Tuscan: grades k-5 closed
 - Clinton: grades 1 &3 closed
 - South Mountain: grade 3 closed
 - Some classes are currently above the average class size range. We are exploring ways to ameliorate these overages by possibly adding an additional team, and/or adding a 6th period to some teachers' schedules in order to reduce class sizes.
 - Columbia High School courses are within the average class size range. There are 54 individual classes which are above the upper limit of the range, but within the flexibility allowed by Board policy.
 - A detailed class size report will be provided at the October Board meeting.
- Clinton School hosted the Regional Achievement Center(RAC) Team for a walk-through to establish benchmark standards for the year. South Orange and Maplewood Middle Schools are scheduled for a walk-through, and to host the RAC Team.

Goal 2 Professional Staff:

- Second round interviews are scheduled this week for two administrative vacancies Supervisor of English Language Arts for grades K-12 and Assistant Principal of Maplewood Middle School.
- The full District Administrative Team (DAT) met for two days in August to lay the foundation for the start of the school year. Maryanne Joseph from the New Jersey Department of Education conducted a workshop on universal design for learning and the least restrictive environment. We also discussed policy issues, communications protocols, and operations.
- New teachers engaged in four days of professional development including, cultural competency and bias awareness with Dr. Khyati Joshi and learning targets and individual student instructional goals. New teachers also took a bus tour of the two towns with the Community Coalition on Race. Many thanks to Carol Barry Austin and Sue Meredith from the Coalition for introducing our new teachers to our community.
- All staff had a full day of Professional Development before schools opened. Topics ranged from creating higher order thinking questions to next generation science standards to artist and gallery walk to individualized learning plans for English Language Learners, to

understanding and infusing culturally responsive teaching in the classroom.

- A Convocation was held for all district staff.
 - o District administrators greeted staff wearing "Make It Happen!" shirts - which is our theme for the year.
 - o Larry Leverett, Executive Director of the Panasonic Foundation and a past South Orange Maplewood School District Administrator, spoke to staff about creating a culture of achievement, where we all work together to ensure that adults are successful and children are successful.
 - o Dr. Ramos spoke to staff about equity and excellence as our unconditional pathway and asked us all to commit to making good on the idea of preparing each child for the promises and challenges of tomorrow.

Goal 3 Engagement and Outreach:

- Interest areas were launched for each school on Let's Talk! and administrators at every school have been trained on the system. Information is going home to families to promote use of this tool to enhance communications between families and our schools and district.
- This year, we introduced a system to inform families of the "directory information" which the District can share with outside organizations, including PTAs and HSAs, and how to opt out.
- The District Administrative Team (DAT) reviewed communications protocols to establish more consistency across the district.
- Back to School Nights are taking place throughout September, to welcome parents as partners in their children's education this year.

Goal 4 Resource Management:

- Facilities issues have been taking up a lot of time, including:
 - The Columbia High School pool is closed due to structural instability and is not reparable. The Administration and the Board will discuss plans for the current pool space as part of the longrange facilities plan.
 - o The swim team will meet at the Union YMCA for both practice and home meets for the 2016-2017 school year.
 - A ceiling partially collapsed in the Board of Education building, affecting the Information Technology (I.T.) Department and the District Meeting Room. There were no injuries. Engineers are scheduled to assess the building for other possible problem areas.

Goal 5 Creating a framework for advancing the work of the district including the collaborative development of a comprehensive Strategic Plan:

- Dr. Ramos will meet with the co-chairs of the action planning teams next week to review current status and ensure that all teams are on track to present their plans to the Strategic Direction Committee in October.
- The Board is planning a series of community engagement events around the strategic plan in November and December, including Education Summit 2 scheduled for December 6th.

The purpose of the committee is to articulate student needs and wants to the Board of Education. Mr. Saulean also spoke about early start-up of student clubs and schedule concerns at CHS.

Ms. Baker provided an update on drafting of district goals for the currents school year, the Board retreat and the committed pursuit of N.J. School Board Certification to put in place best practices as a Board for policy making and communication with administration and other members of the community. The Board also made a recommitment to cultural competency.

Topic Jenny Lindstrom Spoke about electing new SEPAC leadership and SEPAC President challenges faced during the opening of school. Expressed thanks to Dr. Ramos for his openness and responsiveness with meeting with SEPAC leadership and learning the issues that are of importance to the SEPAC community. Ms. Lindstrom also thanked Ms. Maureen Jones who served as the SEPAC liaison and other Board members for their support.

Ms. Baker asked Dr. Ramos to follow-up with Ms. Lindstrom regarding her concerns.

Elissa Malespina Thanked the Board for hiring a librarian at South South Orange Orange Middle School. Concerned supplies /equipment may have been reduced due to budget cuts.

- Matt KritzbergPresented a petition with 365 signatures of ColumbiaCHS StudentHigh School students who are in support of baseball
coaches Joseph Fischetti and Matthew Becht.
- Eliot Dix Spoke in support of Mr. Fischetti and Mr. Becht. CHS Student Coaches have made a positive impact on and off the field.
- Juani Tantillo Maplewood Read a letter written to Dr. Ramos and the Board in support of Coaches Fischetti and Becht. Spoke on behalf of Columbia High School baseball players and parents and Essex County baseball coaches present during the meeting. Questioned the decision of Dr. Ramos and the Board not reappoint coaches Fischetti and Becht.

Ms. Jones provided an update on 8th grade English Language Arts, K-5 Science and K-8 Social Studies curriculum revisions, implementing Win (Whatever I Need) period at both middle schools, search for Maplewood Middle School Librarian, Special Education staffing and training and bringing out of district special education students back in district.

Board member comments included making the WIN period more consistent between middle schools and improvements to the WIN period in the current school year.
