A Regular Meeting of the Board of Education of South Orange-Maplewood was held in the Auditorium at the Montrose Early Childhood Center, 356 Clark Street, South Orange, New Jersey, on February 27, 2017.

Board President Elizabeth Baker called the meeting to order at 7:57 p.m.

BOARD RECOGNITION - Mr. Sabin

The awards ceremony was Thursday, Feb. 23 at the Montclair Art Museum.

On January 28th, Junior Matthew Lintern represented the Columbia High School Choir as the top-scoring baritone in the North Jersey Region Honor Choir. Hundreds of students from across northern NJ auditioned for the choir.

On February 11th, the Columbia High School Excelsior Singers were featured guest performers in the Montclair State University #Inspired Showcase Gala Concert in honor of the tenth anniversary of the John J. Cali School of Music and the rededication of the Kasser theater. Throughout the day, the students attended rehearsals and master classes with Montclair State University faculty in preparation for the evening concert. Under the direction of Ms. Bunce, the Excelsior Singers performed a 20 minute program and then shared the stage with the Morris Knolls Chorale and the Montclair State University Singers for a combined program. Ms. Jamie Bunce is the Choral Teacher and Director

Marshall School teachers, Mrs. Stephanie Rotondo and Mrs. Vanessa Proietto, presented at the Association of Mathematics Teachers of New Jersey Winter Conference on December 8, 2016. The theme of the conference was "creating exciting, engaging, and motivating mathematics classrooms". Mrs. Rotondo 's and Mrs. Proietto's session focused on maximizing instructional time, exploring how to engage and motivate students through rotations, and meeting the individual needs of students during small group work.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Ms. Baker declared the minutes of the Executive and Public Sessions of January 30, 2017 and February 13, 2017, approved as presented.

SUPERINTENDENT'S MONTHLY UPDATE - Dr. Ramos

Goal 1 - Adoption and Initial Implementation of Strategic Plan:

- We have developed an implementation schedule for year one of the Strategic Plan initiatives, focusing on initiatives that we have already piloted, or are prepared to launch quickly.
- The next step will be to engage more stakeholders, particularly teachers and administrators, in providing feedback on the creation of a 3-year implementation schedule.

Goal 2 - Responsible Financial Management:

- There is a budget presentation on for discussion later this evening.
- The Finance Facilities and Technology Committee will review proposals from our consultant on building utilization, Ross Haber, this month.
 - Once the Board has reviewed the proposals, we will develop a plan for next steps, including for community engagement and feedback.
 - o We anticipate that no changes will be made until the 2018-2019 school year at the earliest.

Goal 3 - Execution Plan that Assures Effective Implementation of Board of Education Policies and Monitoring:

- Tonight, the Board of Education plans to pass a resolution affirming our commitment to educate all children.
- Our transgender student policy is in effect and we are proceeding with implementation.
- Access and Equity
 - o The district is finalizing its work to meet its March obligation of revising the Academic Placement Regulations
 - o Credit recovery programming is underway for 70+ students who are working on Saturdays to develop academic, social, and emotional learning that will increase their engagement in school and restore credits due to excessive absences. Credit is restored AFTER successful completion of the program and regular attendance.
 - Class offerings for next year, staffing, and course programs are being finalized as the Columbia High School team works to build the 17-18 schedule in the coming weeks.

- The district has provided the second of four School Wide Data Team trainings for our (DAT) District Administrative Team to meet its June obligation to establish School-Wide Data Teams at all of our schools to successfully monitor A&E goals and initiatives.
- Focus schools update:
 - o Clinton had their final walkthrough of the year. We have received the RAC's summary report of trends and recommendations.
 - Maplewood and South Orange Middle Schools will have their final walk throughs in late March.

Goal 4 - Develop a Plan to Improve the Climate and Culture in Our School Community:

- The spring Elementary Parent Teacher Conferences will take place on March 1, 2 and 3. Please remember that all elementary schools will operate on a 4-hour day schedule on conference days.
- The Partnership for Assessment of Readiness for College and Careers (PARCC)testing will begin in late March. Schools will advise families of the testing schedule for their students. Families who refuse to permit their children to participate in PARCC must submit a letter to their child's principal by March 10th.
- SOMSD is partnering with Maplewood and South Orange elected representatives to host a Community Forum for Immigrants on March 2nd at Seth Boyden Elementary School. Local immigration experts will discuss issues such as the recent executive orders, deferred action for childhood arrivals, and the rights of immigrant, as well as answering questions.
- Cultural Competency
 - o Dr. Joshi met with professional learning communities in all elementary and middle schools to discuss their ongoing work and plan next steps.
 - Tomorrow, Dr. Joshi will present "Who Belongs" assemblies at Clinton and Seth Boyden, highlighting issues of inclusiveness.
 - o Two free professional development opportunities are available
 for all staff:
 - Responding to Bias in the Classroom at Montclair State University.
 - Anti-bias education and culturally relevant teaching at Fairleigh Dickinson University with Dr. Joshi.
- Community Engagement events -
 - On February 6th, we held a community screening of the groundbreaking documentary film 13th at South Orange Middle School. The conversation after the film was very thoughtful and though provoking.
 - We have rescheduled our Getting Ready for Middle School event Getting Ready for Middle School will now take place on Thursday March 23 at SOMS and Thursday March 30 at MMS.
 - The Columbia High School leadership team is working to make sure family engagement programs are accessible to all families, including those who cannot attend weeknight events.
 - CHS hosted a Saturday family program offered by a local LCSW and former CHS parent, entitled "College with Confidence', focusing on the ways schools and families

can work to strengthen the overall health and wellness of teens as they prepare to make transitions to college. This was the first Saturday parent academy program at CHS.

- Later this month CHS will host "Stressors and how to Avoid Them," targeting teens and parents.
- In February, we have had a number of Professional Development initiatives:
 - o $5^{\rm th}$ grade math teachers met to plan for articulation to $6^{\rm th}$ grade.
 - o The entire administrative team participated in a day long workshop on using the Danielson framework effectively as an observation tool
 - o 8th grade ELA teachers held a labsite in Megan Alloway's classroom to share best practices.

Ms. Baker spoke about the gradual degradation of being able to provide quality public school education, supporting community groups that are fearful of being targeted by the federal government, resolution affirming our rights to provide quality education to all district students, adoption of Board Member Committee charges on for approval tonight and Board goals. Ms. Baker explained committee charges detail the responsibilities of each committee.

2017-18 Budget - Mr. Roth

Mr. Roth presented a Powerpoint presentation on the 2017-18 Preliminary Budget development process with focus on:

- Budget Development Process
- Anticipated Revenue Sources
- Zero Based Budgeting
- Appropriations (Anticipated Expenditures)
- Determine Deficit or Surplus
- Budget Considerations
- Next Steps

[Presentation is on file in Board Secretary's office and posted on the district website].

Presentation was followed by discussion among Board members including the following comments and questions:

- Confirmation that even with the use of banked cap there will be a deficit of close to \$900,000.
- All Districts in Essex County are underfunded with the South Orange Maplewood School District in the middle range on the funding chart.
- Capital reserve and bond sales as a source of revenue.
- Student activity accounts cannot be used to fund the operating budget.
- Are there any financial implications as a result of the Township of Maplewood becoming a Sanctuary City for refugees and illegal immigrants.

AFFIRMATION OF COMMITMENT TO EDUCATE ALL CHILDREN - Ms. Baker

Ms. Baker read resolution 3536 Affirming Our Commitment to Educate All Children.

ITEMS FOR ACTION MOVED FORWARD

MOTION made by Mrs. Lawson-Muhammad, seconded by Ms. Adamson, to approve the following:

WHEREAS, the South Orange Maplewood Board of Education recognizes the unique ethnic, racial and cultural diversity of our School District and celebrates this diversity; and

WHEREAS, approximately 26 percent of Maplewood residents and approximately 20 percent of South Orange residents are foreign-born; and

WHEREAS, the School District of South Orange Maplewood has a well-settled obligation under the Constitution of the United States to provide a free and appropriate public education to all school-age children without

regard to their immigration status or their family members' immigration status; and

WHEREAS, the School District of South Orange Maplewood has a well-settled obligation under the Constitution of the United States, the Constitution of the State of New Jersey, federal and state law to provide equal educational opportunity for all students; and

WHEREAS, the Board has adopted a series of policies to ensure that all school age children in the district receive a free and appropriate public education and equal educational opportunity, including Policy No. 5750 (Equal Educational Opportunity); and

WHEREAS, student records are private and confidential; and

WHEREAS, the Board has taken note of historical and recent rhetoric targeting immigrant communities, ethnic groups and religious populations; and WHEREAS, the Board desires to assure all South Orange and Maplewood residents of the district's commitment to educating all school-age children who live in the district, as required by law; and

WHEREAS, the School District of South Orange Maplewood is committed to ensuring that the climate in district schools is welcoming for all students and their families, and that all students' families are treated as partners in their children's education; and

WHEREAS U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE) policy characterizes public schools as "sensitive locations," places where, in the normal course, enforcement actions should not occur; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that while the Board acknowledges the mission of law enforcement agencies charged with enforcing our Nation's immigration laws, the role of the school district is to ensure the education of all school-age children for so long as they may reside in South Orange and Maplewood; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Board reaffirms its commitment to equal opportunity for all school-age students residing in South Orange and Maplewood to attend, and to enjoy all opportunities and benefits available in the schools of our district, regardless of ethnicity, national origin, race, immigration status, or religious beliefs, free from harassment or intimidation, for so long as they may reside in South Orange and Maplewood; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Board will protect student confidentiality and will not share private information unless required by law or a court order, and we expect all persons employed by and in the South Orange Maplewood School District to protect student privacy and confidentiality as well; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that, in keeping with this commitment, the Board's General Counsel shall advise the school district's Administration regarding the obligations and limits of the district's obligations to cooperate with federal immigration enforcement, and that the Administration shall comply with all legal obligations but refrain from voluntary cooperation beyond those limits; BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Superintendent is requested to i) share this Resolution with all staff employed by the school district; ii) request that all vendors employing personnel in district schools share this Resolution with their personnel; and iii) provide guidance, including regulations if necessary, and training to district schools as to steps that shall be taken to ensure that the district's commitment to educating all children is communicated and reinforced with students, families and community stakeholders.

Board members discussed resolution 3536 and recommended changes to the resolution.
