SUPERINTENDENT'S MONTHLY UPDATE

Superintendent Dr. Thomas Ficarra updated the Board and community on district progress, including a major overhaul of the heating system in the A wing at Columbia High School, collaborative work to prepare for Quality Single Accountability Continuum (QSAC) reviews, looking into possible data warehouses to give us the ability to examine data more effectively, beginning budget development for 2018-2019 school year including more targeted process for determining special education needs, and planning a comprehensive training schedule.

BOARD PRESIDENT'S UPDATE ON BOARD GOALS

Board President Elizabeth Baker provided an update on district and board goal setting for the year, which will be the topic of a Board retreat in November or December.

Topic

Julia Sommer Maplewood Spoke on behalf of parents of students that attend Montrose Early Childhood Center. Asked the Board to consider changing the transportation policy to permit general education students to receive transportation services if their sibling with an IEP attends the same school.

- Mitch Center Concerned with the HIB process. Feels the district Maplewood may be using a narrow definition of HIB and the law allows districts and Boards to use a broader definition for the process and make judgments based on the evidence provided. Mr. Center expressed his disappointment that the Board voted in favor of former Superintendent Dr. Ramos receiving 85% merit pay. He also asked administration to urge teachers to update student grades in the PowerSchool database in a more timely fashion.
- Raina Hackett Moved to SOMSD for diversity. Diversity does not CHS student equate to integration. Spoke about her experience as a minority student in SOMSD from elementary through high school. Feels the district does not serve minority students or offer the opportunity for minority students to access advanced level courses.
- Walter Fields Read a statement to the Board on behalf of the Maplewood SOMA Black Parents Workshop (on file in Board Secretary's Office).
- Stephanie Mafla-Mills Maplewood Spoke about the lack of diversity in science and math at the university level. Students should be engaged in math and science at an early age. Proud to share with the Board how Seth Boyden Elementary School is engaging students in math, science and nature. With the help of Principal Frye, students will have access to robotics workshops, 8 weeks of extra-curriculum in the garden and through a possible collaboration with Rutgers University more opportunities with STEM.
- Gabe Gebremedhin Echoed the sentiments of Ms. Mafla-Mills. Happy Maplewood to hear Seth Boyden School is adding STEM as a special. Excited to hear of the schools plan to put together a robotics lab and that students in multiage classrooms with have two teachers in the room during math instruction. Spoke about Principal Frye's efforts to include all students in extracurricular activities by offering activities to students afterschool.

Student Report - Ms. Sandor

Ms. Sandor spoke with teachers and students who reported the following issues at Columbia High School:

- It is easier to move down a level than to move up to higher level courses.
- There is a racial dynamic that allows for white students to have easier access to higher level courses in comparison to students of color. This dynamic defeats the purpose of the access and equity policy and continues to broaden the achievement gap.
- Students who are recommended by teachers for higher level courses are being deferred by guidance counselors.
- There is a lack of afterschool support for students who need extra help.
- The library is not always accessible throughout the day.

DISCUSSION

OFFICE OF CIVIL RIGHTS PRESENTATION - Dr. Morgan and Mr. Walston

Dr. Kalisha Morgan, Director of Planning and Assessment and Mr. Kevin Walston, Assistant Superintendent of Administration provided an update on the Office of Civil Rights Consent Agreement. In 2014, South Orange-Maplewood School District entered into an agreement with the U.S. Department of Education's Office of Civil Rights to provide black students with equal access to participate in rigorous college and career predatory courses within the District. The presentation outlined the following Action Steps:

- I. Hire Consultants to review and assess the District
- II. Restructure academic placement eligibility, counseling,
- family/student outreach and training for District staff
- III. Data Trends
- IV. Next Steps

Board member questions and comments following the presentation included but were not limited to the following:

- Our classrooms do not reflect the diversity of our community. There must be a collective message that all students can succeed.
- Addressing the achievement gap at the high school level is too late. How will we help support students at the elementary level?
- Report demonstrates an issue with our placement system and displays institutional segregation.
- District is not serving our African-American student population. We have to do better.
- The Board passed the Access and Equity policy but there is more work to do. We must continue to support students in their decisions.
- The Board needs an action plan to move forward in a meaningful way. Our intentions are good and would like administration to present actionable solutions.

- College Prep does not prepare students for college. There is a large number of African-American students in college prep.
- The school data team needs to evaluate the data to help make decisions.
- History matters and how the district ended up in this situation matters. The district was built and engineered on purpose and the act to change it is immense.
- The lifting of barriers was just the first step; there is more core work to re-align curriculum and instruction.

2016-2017 EVVRS report - Electronic Violence and Vandalism Report - Dr. Morgan

Dr. Morgan presented a Powerpoint presentation on Violence and Vandalism for the 2016-2017 School Year. A total of 67 incidences were recorded for the district in all categories from violence, vandalism, weapons, substance abuse and HIB. In comparison to the prior year totals, the number of incidents reported have decreased for every category except HIB which shows an increase of 5.

Comments and questions following the presentation included the following:

- A consensus with school principals is necessary to discuss what is reportable and what is not.
- Can this data be collected monthly?
- Data needs to be reported more frequently and consistently.
- Data reflects a huge difference in comparison to prior year totals.
- Reporting needs to take place in real time.
