A Regular Meeting of the Board of Education of South Orange-Maplewood was held in the District Meeting Room at the Administration Building, 525 Academy Street, Maplewood, New Jersey, on November 20, 2017.

BOARD RECOGNITION - *Read by Mr. Sabin*

Three Maplewood Middle School (MMS) students, Gabriella Damens, Clevielle Olarte, and Annabelle Mecca, were presented with prizes by Mr. Randy Falk, creative director at NECA Toy Company, for their creative narrative backstories of character figures. Their writing projects were part of a class study, led by MMS teachers Mr. O'Dell and Mrs. Vorona, of the eight character archetypes found in most heroic journey stories, based on the work of Joseph Campbell's studies of mythology across numerous cultures.

Columbia High School (CHS) Senior Christian Pierre signed a letter of intent to play baseball at the Division I level for St. John's University.

CHS Senior Cameron Herbert signed a letter of intent to play Lacrosse at the Division I level with Bellarmine University in Kentucky.

CHS World Language teachers Debbie Somoza, Laurie Pham, Katie Simpson, and Deb Gomer received a grant from the Montclair University Educators' Network to create a program in which ELL learners and students in AP Spanish and French classes will meet to encourage greater interaction between English Language Learners and students of other world languages; to create opportunities that increase authentic use of the target language; to foster friendships between ELL students and native English speaking-students and integrate them into the greater school community.

Mr. T.J. Whitaker, CHS Teacher of English, is the recipient of the Community Service Award for 2017 by the New Jersey Chapter of the National Black MBA Association, Inc.

Ms. Kandice Point-Du-Jour, CHS Teacher of Dance, was selected as the recipient of the Lifestyle Award for 2017 from the New Jersey Chapter of the National Black MBA Association, Inc.

CHS History Teacher, Mr. James Cotter was selected for the University of Chicago's Outstanding Educator Award.

Mr. Jacob Ezzo, South Orange Middle School Choral Director, won first place in the 2017 Arts Ed NOW "What Does and Arts Ed Now Ambassador Look Like" Contest for the Middle School Category!

Mr. Juan Bas earned his 100th career win as CHS volleyball coach.

Mr. Charles Ezell, Assistant Principal at CHS, was published in May in the New York Academy of Public Education Journal as a co-author of the article : Urban Education Disrupted: Observations from a Successful High School in the Flat World

Ms. Bonita Samuels, Principal of Marshall Elementary School, was selected by Crayola and the National Association of Elementary School Principals (NAESP) as one of 20 elementary and middle school principals from across the nation to receive a Champion Creatively Alive Children school grant.

Mattel just announced that they are making a new Barbie doll modeled after CHS Graduate and Olympic Fencer Ibtihaj Muhammad. This will be the first Barbie who chooses to wear hijab, and is part of the Barbie "Shero" line that honors women who break boundaries.

Karen Weiland, Director of SOMSD's Parenting Center, and parent volunteer Alli Joseph coordinated community-wide efforts as part of the national #ChooseKind initiative. Each of our schools participated in #ChooseKind activities throughout the week, culminating in a special screening of the new movie WONDER based on the book by Raquel J. Palacio. They also received town proclamations from both South Orange and Maplewood, designating them "Cities of Kindness."

#### APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Ms. Baker declared the minutes of the Executive and Public Sessions of October 16, 2017 approved as presented.

#### SUPERINTENDENT'S MONTHLY UPDATE

Superintendent Dr. Thomas Ficarra updated the Board and community on district progress, including the creation of a new electronic reporting system for incidents, updates to the placement process in alignment with the Access & Equity policy, new initiatives in the guidance department to improve outreach to and support for all students and families, professional development in cultural competency taking place this year, development of a proposal to reduce hyper-leveling in the middle schools and high school while still maintaining rigorous courses, and the development of a large scale facilities plan which will reduce overcrowding and solve de facto segregation at the elementary level.

#### BOARD PRESIDENT'S UPDATE

Board President Elizabeth Baker provided an overview of the actions the district has already taken to respond to the issues highlighted in the Office of Civil Rights update from the October meeting, as well as the next steps planned to

fully implement the Access and Equity policy, to ensure that the civil rights of every child are respected, and to design a state of the art curricular experience for every child so that the district is not just meeting our legal mandates, but also fulfilling the values and expectations of our community.

ASBESTOS MANAGEMENT PLAN - Mr. Roth

STUDENT REPORT - Ms. Sandor

Ms. Sandor reported on the following topics:

- CHS Spirit Week ended with the homecoming football game and dance which sold 550 tickets.
- The Student council raised \$600 for solar powered Luci lights to help with hurricane relief in Puerto Rico.
- The Student council attended the NJASC Fall Forum
- Lab hours are offered to students during 3<sup>rd</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> periods to offer access to printers.
- Access to the library continues to be an issue.
- Teachers are unavailable after school to assist students who may need extra help.
- Plan to start a forum similar to Columbia Speaks and offer an email address for students to contact in an effort to make access to Board meetings more accessible to students.

Josh Kleinbaum South Orange	Concerned with the lack of bussing to Marshall School given the hazardous roads his children have to travel to and from Marshall School. School policy and state law require bussing for students over a certain distance and on hazardous routes. Currently the district only has two hazardous routes, which Mr. Kleinbaum feels are not as dangerous as the route his children walk daily. Urged the Board to update the Board policy.
Matthew Giger Maplewood	Spoke in support of correcting the underrepresentation of minorities in higher level classes, but feels the Board should not remove classes that provide rigor and inspire and motivate students to challenge themselves to reach their highest potential.
Sophie Bard & Kevin Tomayo CHS Students	Spoke about MAPSO Cares, a club founded after Hurricane Sandy to help fight hunger throughout the District, through initiatives like Cougar Cares Lunch for all program developed to ensure no student is refused lunch

during the school day and the Weekend Backpack Program which provides CHS student in need with a back pack of food to take home on weekends. Thank You to South Orange Village President Sheena Collum for raising awareness for this cause and Soma Justice and Rent Party for partnering with MAPSO Cares.

DISCUSSION

QUALITY SINGLE ACCOUNTABILITY CONTINUUM (QSAC) SUBMISSION - Mr. Beaumont

Dr. Ficarra provided a brief explanation of QSAC the New Jersey Department of Education's monitoring and evaluation system and the review process.

Mr. Beaumont presented a Powerpoint presentation on the QSAC Submission. The presentation included the results of the district's self-assessment and plans to ensure that all areas are brought into compliance in the areas which raised concerns during the self-assessment.

CLASS SIZE REPORT - Mr. Beaumont

Mr. Beaumont presented the annual class size report, which identifies any classes or sections which are above class limits set by Board policy. All elementary classes are within the allowable exception to the class size policy. SOMS has three classes which are each over the individual section limit by 1 student, and CHS has two volleyball classes over the limit by 1 and 2 students respectively. Short-term and long-term steps to alleviate these overages were presented.

SCHOOL CALENDAR

The initial draft calendar was discussed by the Board. Several questions and suggestions were raised, which will be factored into the discussion as Administration prepares the next draft.

POLICIES - Mr. Sayovitz

Mr. Sayovitz reviewed the policies on for first reading and proposed revisions.

2423 Bilingual and ESL - 1<sup>st</sup> reading

The new code revisions change the reference from student of Limited English Proficiency (LEP) to English language learners (ELL). In general, the new code Chapter provides some additional clarification to a school district in meeting the requirements of providing a bilingual, an English as a second language (ESL), and an English language services program for ELLs. The new code sometimes lists legal guardians and sometimes it does not, based on the legal definition of parent in the administrative code, parent includes legal guardians and others as outlined in the Regulation Guide.

5339 Screening for Dyslexia - 1st reading

The proposed policy includes a minor change to the Administrative Code citation. Additionally, changes have been added, as per discussion at the October 16<sup>th</sup> Board meeting including parental notification and the availability of Section 504 intervention strategies.

Policy 5530 Substance Abuse and 8453 HIV/AIDS are on the agenda for 2<sup>nd</sup> reading.
