A Regular Meeting of the Board of Education of South Orange-Maplewood was held in the District Meeting Room at the Administration Building, 525 Academy Street, Maplewood, New Jersey, on October 15, 2018.

Board President Elizabeth Baker called the meeting to order at 7:35 p.m.

#### BOARD RECOGNITION - Read by Ms. Maini

Columbia High School Senior Stephen Lehren was awarded the rank of Eagle Scout, Scouting's highest recognition, during a Court of Honor Ceremony on September 22 at the South Orange Public Library. For his Eagle Scout project, Stephen created "Heroes of South Orange," an audio archive highlighting the history of local political change and community leaders whose work has significantly impacted South Orange in the areas of preservation, conservation, business, education, athletics and race relations.

South Orange Middle School 6<sup>th</sup> grader Liset Zacker was recently selected by Scholastic to be a Kid Reporter in the award-winning Scholastic News Kids Press Corps. Liset is one of 45 Kid Reporters across the country who will report "news for kids, by kids" throughout the year with coverage of "current events, breaking news, entertainment stories, and sporting events from her hometown and on the national stage."

South Orange Middle School 7<sup>th</sup> grader Charles Keigwin is being recognized by the Sheriff's department in Belvidere, NJ, for excellent citizenship. While on a class field trip to Mackey Orchards, Charles found a wallet and turned it in to the farm office. The wallet contained over \$1,000 - the entire retirement check for someone visiting the farm.

Columbia High School English Teacher Tracy McNamara was selected for the University of Chicago's Outstanding Educator Award. Ms. McNamara was selected from hundreds of teachers nominated by entering first-year students who wrote about "teachers who have changed the course of their lives, who taught them to re-imagine texts, to delve deeper into problem-solving, and to think beyond the borders of the classroom in the pursuit of their own education."

Congratulations to the World Languages/ELL department for doing excellent work preparing students for the AP Language or Literature and Culture Exams. Seventyseven students took exams in French, Japanese, Latin, and Spanish. Special congratulations to AP Spanish teachers Eva Marín and Rocio López - Fifty-eight students took the AP Spanish Language or Literature and Culture Exams with a 100% passing rate. Maplewood Middle School Principal Dara Gronau is being featured in One Day Magazine, the alumni magazine of Teach For America, in an article on balancing life as a principal and a parent.

Elizabeth Aaron, Principal on Special Assignment, served on a panel that presented to educators from throughout the state on September 22 for E4E, Educators for Equity, which supports and strengthens schools' work with and for LGBTQ plus staff, students, and families. Columbia High School was recognized for establishing non-gendered restrooms, the work of our student club Spectrum, and the voices of students through such actions as public art displays, student presentations at a faculty meeting, and our art gallery exhibit for Pride month.

Maplewood Middle School Chorus performed.

#### APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Ms. Baker declared the minutes of the Executive and Public Sessions of September 17, 2018 and the Special Public Sessions of September 24, 2018 and September 25, 2018 approved as presented.

#### SUPERINTENDENT'S UPDATE - Dr. Ficarra

Dr. Thomas Ficarra, Interim Superintendent, updated the Board and community on the four hour Professional Development day provided to staff on October 9<sup>th</sup>. The 4-hour Professional Development day focused on Restorative Practices, Cultural Competency and data-driven instruction. He reported that SOMSD schools observed the Week of Respect with activities ranging from a Chalk it Up to Kindness collaboration between Clinton and Columbia High School; to creating class flags of unity, respect and community building; to Start with Hello conversation starters, as part of the District's ongoing work to prevent bullying and create safe and positive school communities.

## LONG RANGE FACILITIES PLAN

Dr. Ficarra presented the revised Long Range Facilities Plan. He reviewed the process of creating the initial plan, which included consulting with administrators, teachers and custodial staff in each building to identify the most urgent needs. The initial plan recommended \$93.1 million in high priority health and safety repairs and renovations, and \$34.5 million for expansion to meet the district's growing enrollment and the loss of 16 classrooms when decaying portables are removed for safety reasons.

Staff and community input were integral to the next phase of refining the initial plan. In Spring 2018, Dr. Ficarra solicited community feedback at a series of presentations in schools and in the community, in which more than 1000 community members participated. Feedback included:

- Concern over the number of transitions in the proposed reconfiguration for grades K-8
- Request that the District consider alternative program structures
- Desire to keep unique programs
- Recommendations of additional improvements to incorporate into the plan, such as adding air conditioning in schools, and reinforcing roofs to incorporate solar panels.

The revised plan presented at the meeting retained the \$93.1 million in high priority health and safety repairs. It also incorporated community suggestions, including adding another expansion option for consideration, which would entail fewer transitions and incorporate controlled choice for elementary school enrollment. Budget figures were also provided for additional options suggested by community members, which could be incorporated into the final plans, if they are determined to be high enough priority to justify the increased cost. The next steps include collaborative discussions with Board of School Estimate (BSE) members and a public BSE workshop. After these are complete, Administration will submit the final LRFP to the Board of Education for approval, then submit the LRFP to the NJ Department of Education for approval, so that architects can begin developing detailed specifications and drawings.

## BOARD PRESIDENT'S UPDATE - Ms. Baker

Elizabeth Baker, President of the Board of Education, provided an overview of the Board Retreat in September, which included mandatory ethics training, as well as training on the new HIB law and regulations which affect board policy. The Board also began developing Board Goals for 2018-2019.

Ms. Baker also shared an update on the Superintendent Search. Search Consultant Dr. William Librera met with many different constituents and constituent groups, and hundreds of community members completed the survey, to identify the skills and qualities which are most important for SOMSD's next Superintendent. Dr. Librera has compiled all this feedback into a report the Board, which will be used to help create a leadership profile. Ms. Baker will continue to keep the community informed of the progress of the Search.

#### Student Representative Report - Ms. Silver

Ms. Silver provided an update on the following Columbia High School matters:

- Implementation of the STEM/SAM lab has been met with great participation; additional help is needed during periods 1 and 9.
- Reassignment of teacher aides
- Condition of school bathrooms
- District website

- Environmental Club is working on a recycling program for the District.
- Plans to report student needs and concerns for district students at all grade levels.

## HIB SELF-ASSESSMENT(2017-18) - Ms. Butler

In-House Counsel Joanne Butler presented the District's Self-Assessment for the Anti-Bullying Bill of Rights Act (ABR). The report included a comparison of score totals and grades for years 2016-2018. The District continues to meet or exceed the requirements for reporting, training, programs etc. as required by the Anti-Bullying Bill of Rights Act in most areas.

For the 2018-2019 school year, the District will begin using HIBster software, to assist the Anti-Bullying Specialists and administrative staff in timeline compliance, thorough investigations, and accurate, comprehensive reports. Additionally, follow-up reporting to parents will be easier.
