BOARD PRESIDENT'S STATEMENT

NEW BUSINESS

Board Member Malespina - Expressed concern that there appears to be no additional funding in the Budget for social-emotional supports. Would like Administration to think about adding additional resources and doing what we can to help students who are greatly suffering right now.

Dr. Taylor - We are still in the current school year and have not implemented everything that we plan to because some of the programs are paced to happen in the spring. I would like to see those things come to fruition before we begin to add on more programs. There are a lot of additional providers in our schools. We also have Challenge day coming up at the middle schools and high school.

Ms. Bodnar - I just created the amendment to Title IV funding that we received carryover funds for and it is directly connected to our middle schools and high school social emotional learning. Tomorrow I have a group of administrators and teachers coming together to review a possible program. I met with the vendor and found the program to be impressive. Dr. Friedman and I set up some meetings and tomorrow is the first meeting. Let us see what is out there and what we can do for our students.

Dr. Friedman - We had someone reach out to us this afternoon and I am in the process of getting back to them as well. There are definitely other resources available but we need to vet and review them to see

how they can possibly be implemented into everything else we are doing.

Dr. Taylor - As Part of our Intentional Integration work we have been talking to our middle school principals about being prepared to support students who will be going to a school that they did not expect to attend and having additional layers of mental health supports for them that we can fund outside of our normal budget.

Board Member Siders - Perhaps at the next C&I meeting we can also talk about Mr. Fiedeldey. I believe we approved a three year contract with Fiedeldey Consultating for mental health support, so maybe we can talk about year two. I know he specifically had some items around student harm and how to support and identify those issues.

Ms. Bodnar - We have a meeting with Mr. Fiedeldey and building staff to look at next year and see if there are some things that we want to move around. We knew going into the first year that we had our plan to accomplish everything that we wanted to do, but we do want to evaluate what our plan is for the next year so that we can be sure that we are meeting the needs of what is going on with us at the moment. Mr. Fiedeldey is ready and willing to meet with us, to support our needs and offer recommendations.

Dr. Friedman - While we had a three year scope and sequence we knew years two and three would definitely be revised based on our progress and needs moving forward. We feel pretty good about what we have accomplished in year one, but we know that we need to move some things around and we will speak with Mr. Fiedeldey about additional resources and putting some things in place.
