A Regular Meeting of the Board of Education of South Orange-Maplewood was held in the District Meeting Room at the Administration Building, 525 Academy Street, Maplewood, New Jersey as well as utilizing the online video conference platform on December 15, 2022.

SOUTH ORANGE-MAPLEWOOD BOARD OF EDUCATION RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING EXECUTIVE SESSION

WHEREAS, while the "Sen. Byron M. Baer Open Public Meetings Act" (N.J.S.A. 10:4-6 et seq.) requires all meetings of the South Orange Maplewood Board of Education to be held in public, N.J.S.A. 10:4-12(b) sets forth nine (9) types of matters that may lawfully be discussed in "Executive Session," without the public being permitted to attend, and

WHEREAS, the Board has determined that some issues is permitted by N.J.S.A 10:4-12 (b) to be discussed without the public in attendance and shall be discussed during an Executive Session to be held on Thursday, December 15, 2022 at 6:30 PM, and

WHEREAS, the nine (9) exceptions to open the public meetings set forth in N.J.S.A 10:2-4 (b) are listed below, and next to each exception is a box which will be marked when the issues to be privately discussed fall within that

exception, and after each exception is a space where additional information that will disclose as much information about the discussion as possible without undermining the purpose of the exception shall be written:

- ⊠ "(1) Any matter which, by express provision of Federal law, State statute or rule of court shall be rendered confidential or excluded from public discussion." The nature of the matter, described as specifically as possible without undermining the need for confidentiality is attorney/client privilege, HIB reporting.
- \square "(2) Any matter in which the release of information would impair a right to receive funds from the federal government." The nature of the matter, described as specifically as possible without undermining the need for confidentiality is:
- □"(3) Any material the disclosure of which constitutes an unwarranted invasion of individual privacy such as any records, data, reports, recommendations, or other personal material of any educational, training, social service, medical, health, custodial, child protection, rehabilitation, legal defense, welfare, housing, relocation, insurance and similar program or institution operated by a public body pertaining to any specific individual admitted to or served by such institution or program, including but not limited to information relative to the individual's personal and family circumstances, and any material pertaining to admission, discharge, treatment, progress or condition of any individual, unless the individual concerned (or, in the case of a minor or incompetent, his guardian) shall request in writing that the same be disclosed publicly." The nature of the matters, described as specifically as possible without undermining the need for confidentiality are:
- \square "(4) Any collective bargaining agreement, or the terms and conditions of which are proposed for inclusion in any collective bargaining agreement, including the negotiation of terms and conditions with employees or representatives of employees of the public body."
- □"(5) Any matter involving the purchase, lease or acquisition of real property with public funds, the setting of banking rates or investment of public funds where it could adversely affect the public interest if discussion of such matters were disclosed." The nature of the matter, described as specifically as possible without undermining the need for confidentiality is:
- ⊠ "(6) Any tactics and techniques utilized in protecting the safety and property of the public, provided that their disclosure could impair such protection. Any investigations of violations or possible violations of the law." The nature of the matter, described as specifically as possible without undermining the need for confidentiality is: Safety and Security Update.
- M"(7) Any pending or anticipated litigation or contract negotiation in which the public body is, or may become a party. Any matters falling within the attorney-client privilege, to the extent that confidentiality is required in

order for the attorney to exercise his ethical duties as a lawyer." The parties to and docket numbers of each item of litigation and/or the parties to each contract discussed are and the nature of the discussion, described as specifically as possible without undermining the need for confidentiality are: SOMEA Litigation

⊠"(8) Any matter involving the employment, appointment, termination of employment, terms and conditions of employment, evaluation of the performance, promotion or disciplining of any specific prospective public officer or employee or current public officer or employee employed or appointed by the public body, unless all individual employees or appointees whose rights could be adversely affected request in writing that such matter or matters be discussed at a public meeting." described: Employee Numbers

M''(9) Any deliberation of a public body occurring after a public hearing that may result in the imposition of a specific civil penalty upon the responding party or the suspension or loss of a license or permit belonging to the responding party as a result of an act of omission for which the responding party bears responsibility." The nature of the matter, described as specifically as possible without undermining the need for confidentiality is:

WHEREAS, the length of the Executive Session is estimated to be sixty (60) minutes after which the public meeting of the Board shall reconvene and proceed with business where formal action will be taken.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the South Orange Maplewood Board of Education will go into Executive Session for the above stated reasons only; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Board hereby declares that its discussion of the aforementioned subject(s) will be made public at a time when the public's interest is disclosure is greater than any privacy or governmental interest being protected from disclosure.

BOARD RECOGNITION AND APPRECIATION FOR BOARD MEMBER SERVICE

Dr. Taylor acknowledged the contributions of outgoing Board Members and made the following comments:

The community does not always see all that Board Members are doing in service of your children. The Board meeting is just a fraction of the work that they do. Board Members review hundreds of pages of documents and attend hours long committee meetings. This is a volunteer service and these volunteers have given so much to your community. In the last few years they have settled fair agreements with the teachers and administrators collective bargaining units, begun and now are in the middle of monumental improvements to our facilities, shepherded in innovative and aggressive researched-based integration program, implemented Atlas Curriculum Development Platform, monthly updates to keep the community informed and overseen the relaunching of the District's social media presence. We've accomplished so much together. The Board has also made it a priority to increase the security of our facilities for the protection of our students and staff. This is very apropos to end on as yesterday was the 10 year anniversary of the tragedy at Sandy Hook Elementary.

Dr. Taylor asked for a moment of silence to reflect on this unimaginable loss.

Recognition of Board Member Johanna Wright

Board Member Telesford acknowledged Board Members Wright for decades of contributions to the district as a teacher, basketball coach and Board Member referring to her as an Icon in the South Orange Maplewood District who instilled and motivated many generations of students by demonstrating what it means to have cougar pride. Board Member Wright was honored with the Essex County Education Associations Human and Civil Rights Award and the Women in Leadership 2016 award from the NJ chapter of the National Black MBA Association Inc. Board Member Wright is a free thinker unafraid to speak her mind and served as a template that other Board members can learn from. Board Member Wright's focus has always been on students and serving three terms on the Board of Education makes her one of this district's longest serving Board Members. Board Member Wright, you have left your mark on this district. Thank you for your service and dedication to this district and community.

Board Member Wright thanked Board Member Telesford for his comments.

Dr. Taylor read Mrs. Wright's plaque.

Recognition of Board Member Erin Siders

 $1^{\rm st}$ Vice President Bergin recognized Board Member Siders for her service to the Board of Education.

VP Bergin spoke about the grace, hard work and dedication of Board Member Siders and what a loss her absence will be to the Board of Education. In her first year on the Board she served on the Executive Committee as 2^{nd} Vice President and chaired the Policy Committee, two big roles for a new Board Member. In her next years on the Board, Board Member Siders chaired the Curriculum and Instruction Committee which is a huge job and focus of the Board of Education and in her final months, she established the Special Services Committee to focus the Board and the District on Special Education students who have felt the impact of the pandemic and staff shortages the greatest. Board Member Siders also served on the Statewide NJSBA Delegate Assembly and Policy Subcommittee. Under her leadership the NJSBA Delegate Assembly adopted a position statement affirming and supporting LGBTQ+ students across New Jersey. Best Practices for the safety and support of LGBTQ+ students are now included in the NJSBA Statewide Manual. As a long time parent advocate, the Board will miss the institutional knowledge of Board Member Siders around the horseshoe. On behalf of the Board and the South Orange Maplewood School District Community, we want to thank you for your service, advocacy and leadership.

Board Member Siders

Board Member Siders reflected on her time as a Board Member and how beginning her term during a global pandemic delayed and derailed what she thought her Board experience would be. Nevertheless, she is proud of what the Board was able to accomplish, especially the success of the Intentional Integration Initiative. The composition of our schools is changing for the better, to be more reflective of our community and this is just the first step. We all recognize there is more work to be done, especially around the student experience within the classroom and within our buildings and that work is continuing via District Goals focusing on Restorative Practices and student achievement. To my fellow Board Members continue to collaborate, grow and work on the Board's number one priority. Setting policy and procedure is the reason why we are all sitting in this horseshoe, it drives the work that we do and how we want the culture and climate of schools to be reflected.

To Dr. Taylor, SLT, District Staff and staff at 525 Academy Street, it was a pleasure working with you. I've learned so much from you and your expertise. I've learned so much of what its like to be on the other side of the table, not just as a parent and a community member.

Recognition of Board President Thair Joshua

Board Member Winkfield recognized Board President Thair Joshua for his service to the Board of Education.

Board Member Winkfield spoke about Board President Joshua's leadership through some of the most unprecedented and challenging times in public education, having to navigate schooling decisions in a global pandemic. Board Member Winkfield acknowledged Board President Joshua's almost photographic memory, ability to conjure specific policy numbers, resolution dates or legal

information and his unrivaled work ethic and commitment to this Board, district and community. Board President Joshua has spent more time working on behalf of this district than the Board combined. His accomplishments during the past three years are too long to name in this setting, but here are a few important highlights: Renaming Jefferson Elementary School to honor a local graduate Delia Bolden, keeping the district focused on the ambitious long range facilities plan, even through the complicated challenges of supply and demand brought on by the global pandemic, restructured Board committees to better align to the needs of the district and the creation of the Safety Data and Special Services committees ensuring that the unique challenges of our district have a dedicated place to focus on problem solving.

Board President Joshua's communication and information sharing with fellow Board members ensured the Board knew what was happening, what needed attention and consideration and what required action. In his transition to Board President he instituted and onboarding process for new Board Members to ensure they have access to critical documents and information to help them begin their terms with the context necessary to fully engage on day one. Board President Joshua also led negotiations on the ASCA and SOMEA contracts. These accomplishments and more encapsulate the kind of steady focused leadership that he has embodied throughout the past three years. We have been lucky to serve under your leadership, even if we often did not deserve you. I am grateful for your service, I am grateful to your family for their sacrifice and I know that you will continue to push, challenge and advocate for the students in this district for years to come.

Board President Joshua

Board President Joshua reflected on some of the accomplishments he is most proud of beginning with our district's students. Every year we remind ourselves that students come first. We should never forget that. In fact students are listed at the top of the district's organization chart to keep us grounded in our mission and focusing on improving student outcomes. Board President Joshua spoke about how the Covid-19 pandemic changed what he thought his experience as a Board Member would be and how proud he is of the district's ability to pivot to a world that was unfamiliar to all of us, learning to teach, run the district and conduct business in virtual or hybrid settings.

Board President Joshua also spoke about the success of the Intentional Integration Initiative, an integral part of improving the outcomes of black students, the progress of the long range facilities plan, the renaming of Jefferson Elementary School to Delia Bolden, negotiating a deal with SOMEA that fairly compensates our teachers, ensuring that the base salary for new teachers will be over 58,000 in September 2023 and negotiating a contract with district administrators (ASCA).

Board President Joshua stated how proud he is to be the first black male President of the South Orange Board of Education. We frequently talk about

how representation matters and in a district that has long subjected black boys to disparities educational outcomes, I know this representation matters.

To our student reps Noah and Vanessa as well as their predecessors Lily and Jakhi, thank you. Your student perspective is an integral part of what we do here and your voices are always heard.

Thank you district administrators and everyone at 525 Academy Street who helps the district operate successfully. The Board is not supposed to run the district, but ensure its well run and these are the people that make everything come together. I would like to acknowledge Keith Bonds and Benjamin Myers who make this hybrid meeting process work and also Marisol who always greets me with a smile when I get here before the doors are open. Thank you to my colleagues past and present, I've learned something from each and everyone one of you. Erin siders, when we hit the campaign trail three years ago it was to do something we had never done before, win an election. Three years later I have something I've never had before, a big sister. Lastly, thank you to my family who is here this evening. To my parents, I know I have made you proud. To my kids I am proud to be your dad, you both make me proud every day. Last but never least, thank you to my wife for allowing me to serve this community these past three years.

Any rescission of this resolution shall not affect any Agreements entered into prior to such rescission or expiration.
