SOUTH ORANGE-MAPLEWOOD BOARD OF EDUCATION RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING EXECUTIVE SESSION

WHEREAS, while the "Sen. Byron M. Baer Open Public Meetings Act" (N.J.S.A. 10:4-6 et seq.) requires all meetings of the South Orange Maplewood Board of Education to be held in public, N.J.S.A. 10:4-12(b) sets forth nine (9) types of matters that may lawfully be discussed in "Executive Session," without the public being permitted to attend, and

WHEREAS, the Board has determined that one (1) issue is permitted by N.J.S.A 10:4-12 (b) to be discussed without the public in attendance and shall be discussed during an Executive Session to be held on Thursday, February 27, 2025 at 6:30 PM, and

WHEREAS, the nine (9) exceptions to open the public meetings set forth in N.J.S.A 10:2-4(b) are listed below, and next to each exception is a box which will be marked when the issues to be privately discussed fall

within that exception, and after each exception is a space where additional information that will disclose as much information about the discussion as possible without undermining the purpose of the exception shall be written:

- **X** "(1) Any matter which, by express provision of Federal law, State statute or rule of court shall be rendered confidential or excluded from public discussion." The nature of the matter, described as specifically as possible without undermining the need for confidentiality, is attorney/client privilege and personnel.
- $\mathbf{X}$  "(4) Any collective bargaining agreement, or the terms and conditions of which are proposed for inclusion in any collective bargaining agreement, including the negotiation of terms and conditions with employees or representatives of employees of the public body."

WHEREAS, the length of the Executive Session is estimated to be seventy-five (75) minutes after which the public meeting of the Board shall reconvene and proceed with business where formal action will be taken.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the South Orange Maplewood Board of Education will go into Executive Session for the above-stated reasons only; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Board hereby declares that its discussion of the aforementioned subject(s) will be made public at a time when the public's interest in disclosure is greater than any privacy or governmental interest being protected from disclosure.

Motion made by Board President DuVall Wilson, second by Board Member Eckert to adjourn to Executive Session. Motion unanimously approved.

## BOARD PRESIDENT UPDATE

Board President DuVall Wilson acknowledged the hard work of the Superintendent, Business Administrator, and Assistant Business Administrators, Central Office Administrators and School Principals who have all been hands on deck for weeks to engage in an audit, rebuild our district budget and prepare the 2025-26 budget with looming tight deadlines and deficits to close while also forecasting for the future. All of this with two new Business Administrators who have not even been here for six months yet. A big thank you to their unwavering dedication thus far.

Board President DuVall Wilson reminded the community that tonight, the Board will vote to allow the district to send the preliminary budget to the County Executive Superintendent, so that the County Executive Superintendent can address any issues that the district may need to address. This process is required; until then, the district and the board will continue to review the budget, address concerns, make adjustments, and provide recommendations to

ensure the budget aligns with our goals and priorities. Budget adoption is scheduled for April 24, 2025.

If the Superintendent of Schools/Chief School Administrator is satisfied that the matter is ready to be presented to the Board of Education, it is then referred to the appropriate Board Committee. The Members of the Board Committee work with Administration and the Superintendent to assure that the members fully understand the matter. After the committee discusses the matter, it is then shared with the other Board members for consideration. Only then is it placed on the agenda for Board discussion and action at a public meeting.
