The Columbia High School Girls Track Team, **Olivia Baker**, **Aigner Bobbitt**, **Imani Coleman** and **Emilie Cowan** won for the second straight year at the Penn Relays. It was the second straight 4x800 title for Columbia, which became the first U.S. team to win the girls 4x800 at the two times at the Penn Relays.

In addition, Olivia Baker was named the High School Girls Athlete of the Meet for Relay Events at the Penn Relays for the second straight year.

Baker ran a meet record split of 2:02.55 on to overcome a 5.5 second deficit on the anchor leg of the 4x800-meter relay Championship of America and brought Columbia across first in 8:45.37, a New Jersey record and the second fastest time in U.S. history.

The Stanford-bound Baker also threw down a 52.93 anchor leg in the 4x400 trials, and ran a 54.10 anchor to bring Columbia across fifth overall and first among American teams in the 4x400 Championship of America race in 3:45.27.

Baker is the sixth girl to win two straight High School Girls Athlete of Meet awards, and the second from N.J. to win it back-to-back years.

Coach Lisa Morgan and teammates greeted Baker at the finish line. Additional coverage can be viewed on the district's <u>website</u>.
