- 4. Columbia High School senior, Sydney Scruggs, captured the boys' 100meter hurdles at the Meet of Champions clocking 14.15. Sydney also earned a gold medal for his 6th place finish the 400-meter hurdles. Sydney is the only runner in the state to break 14 seconds in the 100- hurdles this season. Sydney is coached by track coach Lisa Morgan.
- 5. The Columbia High School Excelsior Singers won first place and secured a rating of "Superior," at Music in the Parks in Ocean Grove competition. The students earned the highest score category possible in the contest. In addition, senior Nigel Finley won the award for Best Solo. Members of the Excelsior Singers are:

 - The directors of the ensembles were Elizabeth Harris, Don Tighe and William Cook.
- 8. Jack Woods, a fifth grader at Jefferson Elementary School, won the gold medal at the National Fencing Championships. With this win, Jack is ranked number one in the country in the Youth 12 years and under Men's Foil division. Jack, who holds a "B" rating, captured the win by eliminating "his top competitors one by one with sophisticated moves, signature high speed and precision."
- 9. Two South Mountain Elementary School students, Zoe Lynch and Hannah Rose Saurborn, 4th graders, were among the 15 winners, selected from more than 700 entries, of the annual "My Essex County" Poster Contest in a ceremony held at the Essex County Court House. Students received an engraved medal and certificate and their art work will be featured in the upcoming 2014 Essex County calendar. Mr. Brent Jones and Mrs. Tamara Murphy are the South Mountain fourth grade teachers for these local young artists.
 - Jefferson fourth grader Zander Rhodes won an Honorable Mention in the contest as well. Her teacher is Mrs. Deborah Bialer.
- 10.Columbia High School students join the ranks of writers Sylvia Plath, Truman Capote, and Joyce Carol Oates in earning kudos in the $\underline{2012-2013}$ Scholastic Art & Writing Awards. Regional winners of the competition have been announced; those students who have earned a "Gold Key" will see their work advance in the competition.
 - Abigail Baker, Columbia High School sophomore, won a Silver Key for her short story "D Prime" and a Gold Key for a poetry collection.
 - Anna Ferguson, Columbia High School freshman, won honorable mention for her personal essay/memoir, "Scattered." Student submissions are judged by luminaries in the literary arts, some of whom are past award recipients. Notable past jurors include Langston Hughes, Robert Frost, Judy Blume, Paula Poundstone, Lesley Stahl, Billy Collins, and David Sedaris.
- 11.Columbia High School junior, Olivia Baker, makes state history by winning 4 gold medals at the state's Meet of Champions (MOC). She is the first athlete boy or girl to win four MOC titles in the 40-year history of the meet. Baker won 3 individual events: the 100-meter dash, 200-meter dash and 400-meter run, as was part of the winning 4-x-400 meter relay.

Joining baker in the winning 4-x-400 meter relay were Columbia High School Girls Track Team members Cheyenne Trigg, freshman, Shanika Dessein, senior and Maya Hinton, junior. The CHS girls' team earned several other medals at the MOC. Notable finishers for the girls'

- 12. Seth Boyden first grade teacher, Mirian Tager, was invited to present her paper, The Shameful History of Early Childhood Education, on April 29th, at the annual conference of the American Education Research Association in San Francisco. Ms. Tager is a doctoral candidate at CUNY.
- 13. Tuscan Elementary School received the First Step Recognition Award for their Safe Routes to School program. Parent coordinators Candice Davenport and Camilla Zelevansky collaborated closely with Principal Malikah Majeed to establish this innovative program which encourages students to walk and bike to school to promote healthy, active lifestyles and less traffic congestion.
- 14. Tony Mazzocchi, Supervisor of Fine and Performing Arts, was named a quarterfinalist for the first-ever Music Educator Award presented by the Recording Academy and the Grammy Foundation. This award recognizes educators who have made a significant and lasting contribution to the field of music education.

SUPERINTENDENT'S MONTHLY UPDATE - Dr. Osborne

Goal 1

- Middle School Transformation will offer enrichment opportunities throughout the school days and collaborative time for staff members to work together.
- For the first time, students will have the opportunity to accelerate in Language Arts.
- Letters were sent to 5th grade parents about placements next year.
- Invitations were sent for summer step-up programs that will include over 320 courses. The K-2 reading program will be expanded to grade 3 with additional small-group instruction.
- A partnership with Montclair State University in autistic instruction will be voted upon tonight.
- Summer math review packets for high school students will be posted on the website.
- There is now collaboration with town libraries and the district to share summer reading information on all three websites.
- With multiple in-district stakeholders, we are developing criteria for Gifted & Talented programming.
- Curricula are currently undergoing revisions.
- Robotics sequence is currently under review.
- The elementary level enrichment program will be absorbed into the English Language Arts curriculum.
- We are in the process of collecting data for a civil rights audit.

Goal 2

- All kindergarten teachers have participated in Math in Focus professional development workshops.
- The staff has the opportunity to give feedback anonymously on administrators via an online survey.
- Training for substitute teachers has taken place as a result of having seen a decrease in the quality of substitutes over the past year, however there are still concerns over the number of substitutes available. We are working to increase the size of the pool and the quality of substitutes with more recruiting and training.
- Summative evaluations are being collected for all staff members.

Goal 3

- Annual satisfaction survey results have been tabulated and will be presented this evening as a discussion topic.
- The Communications Supervisor and Parenting Center met with PTA's to hear feedback on partnerships.

Goal 4

- Summer projects as part of Capital Plans are being reviewed. Maplewood Middle School will be closed this summer for renovations.
- We are working towards a smooth transition with the new contracted companies including staffing of custodial services.
