APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Mrs. Daugherty declared the minutes of the Public Session of January 7, 2014, the Executive Session of January 15, 2014, and the Executive and Public Sessions of January 27, 2014 approved as presented.

SUPERINTENDENT'S MONTHLY UPDATE - Dr. Osborne

Goal 1

- There will be an update tonight on International Baccalaureate and the middle school transformation.
- There will be an update on the revised Gifted & Talented program tonight.
- "After the Bell" program at the elementary schools is off to a good start with good participation so far. Integration of academic support is part of the program and we hope to include before school academic activities as well.

Goal 2

- Staff performance data is to be submitted in May.
- Cycle One evaluations have been completed for non-tenured and tenured staff.
- Professional Development Staff attended Partnership for Assessment of Readiness for College and Careers (PARCC) workshops and curriculum training for math and science teachers.

Goal 3

- The State of the District annual report that was presented in January is available on the district website.
- The Parenting Center and elementary school PTA's sponsored a program entitled "From Fatherless to Fatherhood," last week at Tuscan School featuring Assistant Principal Kevin Mason.
- Elementary school PTA's also hosted a Martin Luther King, Jr. celebration.
- A Kindergarten Q&A will be held on Saturday for incoming kindergarten parents.
- A Superintendent's Town Hall will be held on February 5.
- Maplewood Middle School will present "Willy Wonka and the Chocolate Factory."

Goal 4

- The 2014-15 budget will be discussed tonight.
- The budget calendar has been changed based on the passage of NJ Assembly bill A4300 that extends the timeline for budget completion.
- An allegation of missing funds has been refuted after a review of the last five fiscal audits that found all dollars accounted for.
- The Board of School Estimate met on January 22 regarding approved projects and bond sales.
- Safety Update A letter will be sent to parents advising of limited access to school buildings.
- Property Services has been dealing with heavy snow removal and some heating issues. South Mountain Annex was closed briefly due to an external heating issue remedied by PSE&G.
- 2014-15 Kindergarten registration is underway.
- The Columbia High School auditorium restoration project is nearing completion; thanks to The ACHIEVE Foundation for their partnership.

Regarding the Safety Update, Mrs. Lawson-Muhammad asked if there will be protocols for dealing with emergencies for parents to pick up children. Dr. Osborne indicated that protocols are still being developed.

HEARING OF INDIVIDUALS AND DELEGATIONS

Name Topic

Ted Cole On behalf of ACHIEVE, he thanked the community ACHIEVE FOUNDATION for their generosity in surpassing the goal for donations to the CHS auditorium restoration project. To date they have donated \$330,000 of the \$350,000 pledged. He recognized Susan & Fred Profeta for their donation of \$150,000 and recommended naming rights for Fred Profeta of the auditorium stage. There will be an event on April 9th to thank all donors.

- Meredith Sue Willis Community Coalition on Race Thanked the Board for their support of programs such as their pre-K open house and Board of Education candidates nights. CCR Will host another Culture Competency workshop and requests support.
- Stewart Glickman Thanked the Board for looking at the Gifted & Maplewood Resident Talented program and suggested accelerated programs such as 6th graders taking 7th grade math be offered earlier to students in elementary schools.

DISCUSSION

<u>Middle School Transformation Update</u> - Mr. Truppo & Mr. Uglialoro, Middle School Principals

Maureen O'Sullivan, Erin Murphy, Helen Dalbey, and Kiini Dordoni, middle school teachers, spoke about their experiences with the International Baccalaureate Middle Years Programme (IB MYP).

Board members had the opportunity to ask questions. Discussion included the following:

- What types of challenges have you faced?
- What is the quality and effectiveness of the professional development you've received?
- The IB Programme provides parallels with the National Board Certification program.

Middle school principals thanked the teachers for championing MYP and for coming tonight to share their experiences.

The middle school principals gave a powerpoint presentation about the International Baccalaureate Middle Years Programme (IB MYP) that included the following highlights:

- Structured assessment tasks for students such as problem solving activities, investigations, organized debates, hands-on experimentation, and analysis and reflection are to allow students to demonstrate achievement according to the objectives for each subject group.
- Professional development requirements for authorization have been fulfilled.
- On-site training with supervisors and teachers
- Internal Training includes peer-to-peer and workshops led by IB Coordinators and administrators
- After-school club opportunities have been expanded
- 6th grade schedule has been revised to provide more support for the teaching staff

Board members had the opportunity to comment and ask questions that included the following:

- Impressed with the attention to the roll-out the program has been given and with communication about it.
- How is the rest of the staff feeling about the implementation?
- How will students not currently taking Spanish in 6th grade be integrated into 7th grade Spanish?
- Does the rigor of curriculum and Common Core match the rigor of IB?

NJSBA Board Member Presentation - Ms. Peterson

Ms. Peterson, a member of New Jersey School Boards Association, presented an overview of the Open Public Meetings Act (OPMA) also known as the "Sunshine Law."

Highlights of the presentation include:

- OPMA insures the right of the public to have adequate advance notice and to be present and participate in meetings where a quorum of the Board is present and at which any business affecting the public is discussed or acted upon in any way.
- Minutes of Board meetings must be made available by the next Board meeting.
- Telephone/email/text communications between Board members may constitute a meeting and be in violation of OPMA.
- Suggested practices include no two-way electronic communication, use a district-issued email address, and avoid communication strings.

Gifted & Talented Program Update - Dr. Furnari

Dr. Osborne offered background related to the revision of the Gifted & Talented (G&T) program that began with a Guiding Change Document in 2012. That document charged the Equity and Excellence Committee to review the current offerings and established a goal to promote the intellectual development of all students, challenging and inspiring them to do their best.

He then introduced Dr. Furnari who presented an update of the progress being made on the revisions. Highlights include:

- Areas of concentration are academics, art, dance/physical education, music and leadership.
- Criteria for identification in each of the above areas have been developed.
- A three-part student identification process consists of an initial recommendation for screening, student screening, and review of findings and recommendation for identification.

Work continues to develop and updates will be provided.

Board members had the opportunity to comment and ask questions including the following:

- Seems as though we've been doing this already; what proposals are new to the program?
- Glad to see enrichment opportunities
- Concerned that opportunities may not be consistent
- How are students identified in non-academic areas?
- How many students district-wide?
- What about social studies and science?
- Guiding Change Document called for a September 2014 start; what is the process to get us there by then?
- Committee to come up with timeline for implementation
- Enrichment activities should have robust offerings for students
- Hesitate to push something that is dependent upon parental support to participate

2014-15 Budget - Mrs. Schneider

Mrs. Schneider presented the preliminary 2014-15 school budget development with focus on:

- The budget development process
- Comparative spending with districts in the surrounding area
- The guiding budgeting principle is to align to District Goal Four and to rein in spending of the major cost drivers such as

- Health Insurance
- Tuition
- Transportation
- Energy
- Resource assumptions
 - State Aid 2014-15 same as 2013-14
 - Federal Grants same as 2013-14
 - Excess Surplus from 2012-13
 - Banked cap available
 - Local taxes will increase no more than 2%

Assumptions are subject to change given the uncertain economic climate.

- Comparison of Revenue Sources 2013-14 and 2014-15
- Multi-Year Impact from 2007-08 actual through 2015-16 projected.
- Analyze to identify projected expenditure reductions of \$2.8 million
- Estimated Tax Impact
- Budget Calendar through April 28 Public Hearing to Levy 2014-15 school tax

State Aid

The Board discussion on State Aid included the following comments:

- Frustrated about the amount of state aid the district received over the years and that it hasn't been fully funded the past couple years
- Resolution tonight asking for the state to review the funding formula to either fully fund or more equitably fund the district
- Distribution doesn't keep up with changing property values. Inter-district choice aid is putting more pressure on other streams of aid
- Resolution doesn't prescribe how to calculate aid. Taxpayers need relief
- Thanks to Mr. Bennett on the amount of research he did on this subject
- Strongly support the work being done, but fully funding will mean an increase in state taxes

Committee Reports

Policy & Monitoring - Mrs. Daugherty

The Board retreat on March 8th will focus on three areas - budget, communication responsibilities, and relationships. The committee is working on a monitoring report for learning opportunities for staff and reviewing policies.

Excellence & Equity - Dr. Gaudelli

The committee reviewed their Charge, the Gifted & Talented program and Level Articulation document which is district goal that they are continuing to work on.

Finance, Facilities & Technology - Mrs. Wren-Hardin

The committee reviewed the budget presentation and discussed capital projects and the CHS renewal process. We will continue to explore a partnership with Maplewood Green Team to do a survey on temperature controls in classrooms.

Community Engagement & Outreach - Ms. Pai

The January meeting was cancelled due to a snowstorm. At the next meeting the Community Forum on Budget will be discussed as well as other opportunities to engage the community.



WHEREAS, the State of New Jersey is required to distribute state aid based upon SFRA; and

WHEREAS, The State of New Jersey has failed to fully fund SFRA, resulting in partial state aid distribution to school districts; and

WHEREAS, partial state aid distribution pursuant to SFRA has been allocated at drastically different percentage levels for different school districts in New Jersey; and

WHEREAS, the South Orange and Maplewood School District "SOMSD") received a mere 20% of the total aid amount determined by SFRA prior to the stabilization cap for fiscal year 2014 (2013-2014 school year), and 57% of the state aid amount after the stabilization cap was applied; and

WHEREAS, funding for other New Jersey school districts for fiscal year 2014 ranged from 9% to 40 times the uncapped aid determined by SFRA, and 47% to 40 times the capped (stabilized) aid determined by SFRA; and

WHEREAS, the New Jersey Department of Education has distributed state aid to school districts inequitably based on SFRA; and

WHEREAS, historically, state aid for SOMSD was reduced significantly in 2010-11 and has not yet been restored despite an increase in enrollment; and

WHEREAS, the municipalities of South Orange and Maplewood have one of the highest tax rates in the state, with local property taxes funding over 94% of the school budget; and

WHEREAS, the SOMSD is faced with sizable lay-offs to staff,

reductions in programming, and increases in class size to keep the tax increase at the statutory 2% level; and

WHEREAS, a 2% tax increase is becoming unsustainable for the property owners of South Orange and Maplewood.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the SOM Board of Education requests a thorough review of equitable state aid distribution based upon SFRA such that if the formula is not fully funded, all school districts receive the same percentage share of their <u>a</u> more equitable distribution of funding as determined by SFRA, and in order to guarantee its constitutional mandate of providing a Thorough and Efficient education.

RESOLVED, that a copy of this resolution shall be forwarded to Senator Richard Codey, Assemblywoman Mila Jasey and Assemblyman John McKeon, Senate President Stephen Sweeney, Assembly Speaker Vincent Prieto, the members of the governing bodies of South Orange and Maplewood, Governor of the State of New Jersey, and to the New Jersey School Boards Association.
