## BOARD RECOGNITION - Read by Ms. Maini

This was one of the thirteen Economics for Leaders programs conducted by the Foundation for Teaching Economics throughout the United States. Deven was presented with a Certificate of Achievement from the Foundation for Teaching Economics for placing at the level of Excellence in the program.

Columbia High School Teachers Janet Bustrin and Suzanne Ryan have been selected for the 2018-2019 Our Lady of Sorrows' Annual Sister Rose Thering Holocaust Education Award, honoring educators who represent Sister Rose's commitment to Holocaust education.

South Orange Middle School Science Teacher Frank Guastella won an EMMY AWARD for BEST ARTS PROGRAM/SPECIAL for his film "I Can't... I Have Rehearsal."

Columbia High School Math Teacher Mark Richman spoke last week the Association of Mathematics Teachers of NJ conference. His talk titled "Just Let Me Survive Today" was focused on how to motivate students through rewards and incentives mixing traditional and new strategies to increase their engagement.

Columbia High School History Teacher Glynnis Childress presented on the benefits of interdisciplinary teams for both teachers and students at a national conference of the Association of Middle Level Educators.

## APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Ms. Baker declared the minutes of the Executive and Public Sessions of October 15, 2018 and the Special Public Sessions of November 1, 2018 and November 7, 2018 approved as presented.

## SUPERINTENDENT'S UPDATE - Dr. Ficarra

Dr. Thomas Ficarra, Interim Superintendent, explained that the District is in the process of updating policies which were identified as either missing or in need of revision in a review by Strauss Esmay, a service used by more than 500 school districts to ensure compliance with changes to code, law and statutes.

### LONG RANGE FACILITIES PLAN

Dr. Ficarra presented his final recommendations for the Long Range Facilities Plan. The plan included revised projections for the expansion options, due to updated enrollment projections. The original expansion options were based on projected enrollment of 7,261 students in 5 years, but the updated projected enrollment is 7,483 students in 5 years.

### The final plan:

- Retained the original \$93.1 M in high priority health and safety repairs.
- $\bullet$  Recommended school configuration of PreK / K-5 / 6-8 / 9-12.

• Recommended \$47.3 M for expansion of schools to accommodate growing enrollment and replace the 16 classrooms which will be eliminated when the deteriorating portables are removed.

The Board of Education will discuss the approved plan as well as additional options, such as adding air conditioning or replacing turf at Underhill Field, with the Board of School Estimate in December.

## BOARD PRESIDENT'S UPDATE - Ms. Baker

Elizabeth Baker, President of the Board of Education, provided an update on the Superintendent Search, including an overview of the Search Criteria which have been developed, with community input, in the following areas:

- Leadership
- Management/Operations
- Curriculum & Instruction
- Human Resources
- Community Engagement

The Board anticipates beginning interviews in January. Ms. Baker will continue to keep the community informed of the progress of the Search.

Interim Principal Dr. Kalisha Morgan and Interim Director of Guidance Scott White presented a summary of the findings of the recent attendance audit, which primarily focused on a general lack of consistency in the implementation of the attendance policy in the past. In response, they have been clarifying attendance expectations and procedures for teachers, students and families. Plans are in place to proactively address attendance issues and students in need of credit recovery.

### BUDGET UPDATE - Mr. Roth

Mr. Roth provided and update regarding the 2019-2020 budget development process. Mr. Roth also explained the difference between the Comprehensive Maintenance Plan and the Long Range Facilities Plan.
