Accountability System

Accountability System

- The U.S. Department of Education approved changes to specific requirements of the No Child Left Behind Act of 2001 (NCLB) for New Jersey public schools.
- The New Jersey Department of Education is transitioning to a new accountability system.
- New Jersey selected the goal of closing half of its achievement gap within six years and calculated Progress Targets for each district, school and subgroups based on closing this gap in equal increments each year.

Progress Target Criteria

Progress Target Criteria

- Reporting criteria requires 30 or more students in a sub group to be considered
- Only students that were enrolled for a year or more are included in the report
- 95% Participation
- District, school and subgroups targets are met by achieving their individually determined targets or achieving a 90% proficiency rate.
- 95% confidence interval

Progress Target Calculations

Performance Target Calculations

- 2010-2011 was used as baseline data
- The percent of students scoring proficient across all grades in each district and school was calculated for each sub-group.
- Establish the 2016-2017 goal by calculating the half way point between the performance of each sub group in 2010-2011 and 100% efficiency.
- Establish annual targets by determining the percent point increase required to reach the target over the six year span (2010-2011 to 2016-2017).

Sample Target Calculation

- 64% of students scored proficient or higher in Language Arts district wide
- 100% 64% = 36 percentage points (PP).
- 36PP / 2 = 18PP
- 64% + 18PP = 82%. The target goal is for 82% of students across the district to score proficient or higher by the end of the 2016-2017 school year
- 18PP / 6 years= 3PP increase each year

Focus Schools

Focus School Calculation Largest Within School Gaps

- The State determined focus schools with the largest in school gaps by identifying the 2 lowest performing demographic group on state standardized assessments for each school. If the gap between the 2 lowest performing demographic groups and the highest performing demographic group was equal to or greater than 43.5 percentage points, the school was designated as a focus school.
- Three years (2008-2009, 2009-2010, and 2010-2011) of standardized test scores for the 2 lowest and the highest performing demographic groups were brought together into a three-year weighted average across all grades in each school.
- Each demographic group had to have at least 30 students in it and represent at least 5% of the student body.

- Focus Schools must meet targets in all subgroups for 2 consecutive years.
- Annual targets increase each year
- Expecting the PARCC assessments to be much more rigorous in the 2014-2015 school year
