School Report Cards New Performance Reports

- School Performance Reports for all schools in the state of New Jersey were introduced for the 2011-12 school year and build upon and replace the older school report cards reports.
- "While the evaluation of student outcome data is crucial for school improvement, we know that these data alone cannot capture the dozens of other essential elements of schools such as a positive school climate, participation in extracurricular programs and the development of noncognitive skills; however, by focusing on college and career readiness and including meaningful comparisons for schools, we hope that these new reports will inform conversations at the local level about where schools are doing well and where they can continue to improve."

School Report Card Measures

- Student Growth
- College & Career Readiness
- Graduation & Post Secondary Enrollment
- Academic Achievement

Peer comparison Groups

- Peer schools comparison groups are created by the state using the following criteria
 - Schools that have similar grade configurations
 - Schools that are educating students of similar demographic characteristics, as measured by enrollment in:
 - Free/Reduced Lunch Programs
 - Limited English Proficiency
 - Special Education Programs
 - About 30 schools in each peer comparison group

Academic Achievement

- Measure of content knowledge in Language Arts and Math
- Proficiency rates on standardized exams

College & Career Readiness

- College and Career readiness measures the degree to which students are demonstrating behaviors that are indicative of future attendance and/or success in college and careers.
- For all elementary and middle schools
 - How many students are chronically absent.
- For Middle Schools
 - Measurement of how many students take Algebra I in either seventh or eighth grade.
- For high schools
 - Participation in college readiness tests such as the SAT
 - Rigorous coursework as defined by participation in AP courses in English, Math, Social Studies and Science.

Student Growth

- Student Growth measures
 - Performance of students from one year to the next on the NJASK
 - Language Arts Literacy and Math
- Student Growth Percentile Methodology

Graduation & Post Secondary Enrollment

 Graduation and Post-Secondary measures the rate at which students who begin high school four years earlier graduate within four years.
 Also included is a measure of the rate at which students in a particular school drop out of school.

Performance Scales

- Very High: 80.0th to 100th percentile.
- High: 60.0th to 79.9th percentiles.
- Average: 40.0th to 59.9th percentiles.
- Lagging: 20.0th to 39.9th percentiles.
- Significantly Lagging: 0 to 19.9th percentile.

PSAT Exams

- Students are tested in 3 areas: Reading, Writing, and Math.
- The PSAT/NMSQT College Readiness Benchmark is the score on each section that a student should meet or exceed to be considered on track to be college ready. The cut scores are different for each tested area and adjusted based upon the students grade level (juniors have higher cut score requirements than sophomores).
