AVTP Program Summary



Providing FREE tutoring to SOMSD students since 1997

- Partnership between Achieve and the District
- Goal to address the racial and economic academic opportunity gap by
 offering assistance to public school students who are at academic risk and
 for whom the cost of private tutoring is a barrier.

Elementary and middle school students are referred by classroom teachers or counselors for the program; CHS students can also complete a request form or see Shannon in the library to sign up.

AVTP Program Summary: Tutors



- Program manager recruits, trains and matches volunteers with students in grades K-12.
 - Adult and teen volunteers
 - NHS students required to do 20 hrs/semester
 - Serving students in all schools K-12
 - After school in each building at least one day/week
 - Wednesday evenings via Zoom and 2 sessions Saturday mornings for all grades
 - ∘ 1:1 model



AVTP Program



- All volunteers receive training by SOMSD faculty
 - best practices, techniques
 - executive functioning/organizational skills
 - consistent w/ district curriculum
- Safety of students is paramount
 - All sessions overseen by site supervisors (SOMSD staff or AVTP coordinator)
 - Adult tutors screened, interviewed, references
 - complete criminal background check
 - all in-person adult tutors vaccinated



- "Very well organized and professional program with excellent tutors."












Comments from Tutors

Other AVTP Initiatives

- Homework help at CHS Loft
 - The Loft is school-based YSP offering free counseling, activities, academic and employment support.
 - Achieve offered on-site weekly tutoring in 2018; reintroduced the popular program this year.
- Essay-writing for MAC scholars
 - Piloted in 2017-18, expanded to now engage 25 volunteers who work with
 MAC students from spring of junior year through fall of senior on college apps
 - Professional essay coaches train volunteers and provide summer workshops for students.
- Looking forward: exploring college test prep tutoring options; music mentorship program



Recent AVTP Challenges

- Difficulty recruiting higher-level STEM tutors
 - Specifically Physics, Calc, AP Stats
- Hopeful the District's tutoring program will fill this void and serve students for whom attendance/commitment is an issue.
 - The two programs will complement each other well.
