

7610 VANDALISM

The Board of Education believes all school district property should be respected and all persons who use or have access to school district property should respect such property and take pride in the institutions of this community and the schools of this district.

Any person who purposely or knowingly damages school district property or damages school district property recklessly or negligently in the employment of fire, explosives or another dangerous means listed in accordance with N.J.S.A. 2C: 17-2 or purposely or recklessly tampers with the tangible property of the school district so as to endanger school district property shall be reported to the appropriate law enforcement agency. Pursuant to N.J.S.A. 18A:37-3, the parent(s)/guardian(s) of any minor who shall injure any public or nonpublic school property shall be liable for damages for the amount of injury to be collected by the Board or the owner of the premises in any Court of competent jurisdiction, together with costs of suit.~~A student of the school district shall be held liable for the damage. Where the damage to district property is more than minimal or has been caused by a minor not a student of this district, the Board will hold liable for the amount of the damage the parent or legal guardian having legal custody and control of the minor responsible for the damage.~~

A person convicted of an offense of criminal mischief that involves an act of graffiti ~~will~~ may, in addition to any other penalty imposed by the Court, be required to pay the reimburse the school district monetary restitution in the amount of pecuniary damage caused by the act of graffiti and to perform community service, which may include removing the graffiti from the property, in accordance with N.J.S.A. 2C:17-3.c. If community service is ordered by the Court, it shall be for either not less than twenty days or not less than the number of days necessary to remove the graffiti from the property. ~~the cost of damages and may be required to perform community service, which may include removing the graffiti from the property, in accordance with the law.~~

A person who purposely defaces or damages district property with any symbol that exposes persons to violence, contempt, or hatred on the basis of any of any protected categories listed at N.J.A.C. 6A:7-1.1(a) may have committed a crime and shall be reported to the appropriate law enforcement agency in accordance with Policy and Regulation 8465, N.J.A.C. 6A:16-6.3, and the Memorandum of Agreement with Local Law Enforcement. ~~face, color, creed, or religion is guilty of a crime and shall be reported to appropriate law enforcement authorities.
