SUBJECT: ESTABLISH GUIDELINES FOR NAMING RIGHTS FOR THE COLUMBIA HIGH SCHOOL AUDITORIUM

WHEREAS, Board Policy 7230 allows for the naming of a facility or location as acknowledgement of a significant gift and indicates a case-by-case process for disclosure and review for upholding both the necessary limits on acknowledgements and their value as a means of recognizing individuals and organizations, and,

WHEREAS, a fundraising campaign for Columbia High School auditorium renovations is in process that has the potential of significant donations, now therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED THAT the Board of Education establishes the following guidelines for naming rights for the Columbia High School Auditorium:

- The auditorium shall not be named for an amount less than \$500,000
- The stage shall not be named for an amount less than \$150,000
- Donor recognition for other components of the auditorium may be in the form of a sponsorship or other equivalent recognition, but not named in recognition of a donation

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT the Board of Education will review any and all naming of the facilities for approval. The placement, prominence and duration of any recognition shall be related to the significance of the donation and will be decided on a case-by-case basis.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

ACHIEVE is currently in the process of fundraising to help support the Columbia High School auditorium renovations. ACHIEVE has asked the Board to consider levels of donations that would be sufficient to allow for naming rights of the facility. The Policy Committee has reviewed policy 7230 with representatives of ACHIEVE and has recommended the donation levels reflected in the resolution. The Board will still need to approve any naming of the facilities as an acknowledgement of a donation. This resolution only establishes an acceptable level of donation for consideration.
